



In 1991, Anna Boyce, RN wrote California's first medical marijuana bill. Passed by the Senior Legislature, the bill was introduced and passed by the state Legislature in 1991, 1992 and 1993. Unfortunately, the bill was vetoed each time by Governor Pete Wilson claiming it violated federal law.

Anna's pioneering work led to the introduction of Prop. 215 of which she was listed, along with Dennis Peron, as a co-author and proponent. She became the chief spokesperson for the initiative debating opponents and appearing in numerous TV commercials that were seen by millions of California voters. Many believe her advocacy and public persona convinced many of these viewers to vote Yes on Prop. 215. Her work was critically responsible for the successful passage of Prop. 215 and gave the marijuana law reform movement its first significant legal victory thereby changing the course of history.
