CCM Minutes
Feb 18th, 2021**

Meeting opened at 6:35 pm with a prayer and pledge by Chair Adams.

Review of January meeting minutes: Motion by Brada Libby to accept, second by Jessica Davidson, no discussion, motion passed.

Review of January Financial Report: Motion by Jessica Davidson to table until the next meeting. Second by Susan Sipes, no discussion, motion passed.

Capital Updates: Jessica Snook providing updates as she works for Jamie Kate's office. HB 17 and SB 554 are up for public hearing. Both bills address CHL policies of where or where you cannot carry. Monday, there is a work session on HB 2543 regarding background checks in that if you do not have your background check back in 3 days, then your purchase will be canceled. Jessica also discussed how to get involved, how to testify for the various bills, and the use of OLIS.

Constitutional Minute with Jeff Heyen: Jeff gave a history of John J., who was one of the first Oregon Governors. He was also a Chief Justice who helped to write the Federalist Papers. Jeff will be offering a new class at his church called Biblical Citizenship in Modern America. It is an 8-week class offered during the 3rd service in conference room C&D.

Activities Update:

1. Raffle – There will be a raffle for Valentine's at the next meeting with many great goodies. The cost will be \$10/ticket for the basket.
2. Will also do a 50/50 raffle at the next meeting if there is a good attendance number. 50/50 raffles success depends on the attendance numbers.
3. Office – Raisia Piatokoff has stepped down to focus on other activities. Therefore, there is a need for a new office manager. In the meantime, Jessica Davidson will manage until the new person is identified. Office hours remain M/W/F from 11 am to 4 pm. With this announcement, Joel Polaski stepped up, stating that he would like to discuss with Jessica assuming the manager's role.
4. Oregon's People's Vote – a new committee formed after the last meeting. There are five members to review voter fraud and clean up the voter rolls. The motto of the group is One Person, One Vote, One Time. They are concerned about HB 5061, and they want to clean up motor voters. They also had a tour of the County Elections office with Bill Burgess, and they have spoken with Bill Post. Jessica Davidson gave an update of the tour and what the group saw during their visit, as well as questions presented to Bill Burgess. The questions they presented were regarding 16 year-olds being allowed to register to vote, signatures not matching when using the DMV electronic signature pad, use of software Syntrix and Oregon Centralized Voter Registration. They also discussed HAVA (homeless) voting process, and ballot drop off sites. Bill Burgess did agree to have an Advisory Committee in which Jessica Davidson asked for volunteers.

PCP Update: Per Jessica Snook

Jessica presented new requests to be appointed PCPs. Jeff Heyen gave a motion to accept the new appointments; Raisia Piatkoff seconded the motion with no discussion. Motion passed.

New Business: by Chair Adams

Bill Thompson has stepped forward as a Salem Keizer School District Board Candidate. Bill gave a brief presentation as to why he is running for the position.

School board positions are open for Districts 1,3,5, & 7. Bill is in District 5.

Applications to be a candidate are due Mar 18th; Elections are 3rd Tuesday in May
