On behalf of the members of the Massachusetts Fiscal Alliance, a non-profit advocacy organization encouraging fiscal responsibility and openness in state government, I'm writing to ask for your support in removing the ban on ride share services at the Boston Convention Center and at Logan Airport from legislation passed by the House last month.

Ride share services such as Uber and Lyft have improved transportation in Boston. Residents, businesspeople and tourists have especially benefitted from the convenience, cost, and quality of new options.

Removing the convention center and the airport from transportation competition is a bad idea. Both areas suffer from inadequate transportation options. Visitors to Boston, especially those traveling for business, are a great source of economic activity.
