What is Line 3?

- Enbridge's Line 3 "Replacement" project is a pipeline expansion which will double the capacity of the Line 3 pipeline without removing the existing, aging pipe.
- The new Line 3 pipeline is proposed to ship oil from Alberta's tar sands through Saskatchewan and south-western Manitoba communities (from Cromer, past Souris, Morden, Winkler and Altona to Gretna), and on into the USA.
- If built, it would be one of the largest crude oil pipelines on the continent, carrying 915,000 barrels per day.

Why should we stop Line 3?

- **It threatens our land and drinking water.** Line 3 crosses the Assiniboine and Red River watersheds and threatens the drinking water for thousands of people along the route.
- **It doesn't make economic sense.** The Line 3 expansion will cost \$7.5 billion, which is a short-sighted investment given the global economy's increasing shift away from fossil fuels causing climate change.
- **It defies the science of climate change.** We need to accelerate our investments in renewable energy infrastructure and rapidly transition away from fossil fuels if we are going to ensure a healthy and sustainable future for our children.
- **It violates Indigenous rights.** The pipeline directly threatens the ancestral lands and inherent rights of Indigenous peoples along the proposed route, who have not been properly consulted.
