

# JEFFERSON COUNTY NON-CONGREGATE SHELTER (NCS)

## OVERVIEW OF HOUSING & SERVICES PROVIDED?

- Includes a 25 hotel room block located centrally in Jefferson County
- Room block is available for 30 days, but may be extended and expanded based on need
- Only medical providers may refer persons to the NCS (see process below)
- On site operations staff provided 24/7 by The Salvation Army
- Persons housed will be provided with 3 meals/day, transportation, medical and behavioral health support provided through telehealth

## WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO STAY at the NCS?

- Individuals and families experiencing homelessness;  
AND one of the following:
- Confirmed COVID-19 positive;
- Suspected COVID-19 based on clinical presentation and pending testing results;
- Suspected COVID-19 based on clinical presentation and exposure risk without testing; *or*
- Known exposure with a close contact (symptomatic or asymptomatic)

## HOW DO YOU REFER SOMEONE TO THE NCS?

*All other non-medical entities (navigators, law enforcement, shelter and supportive services staff, general public, etc.) should **call the Public Health Warm Line at 303-271-8396** if person experiencing homelessness has:*

- Dry cough,
- Sore throat,
- Feeling feverish/have had a fever recently,
- Worse than usual shortness of breath; OR
- Recent sudden loss of taste or smell.

Public health staff will determine if person qualifies for NCS. Transportation will be arranged for all persons housed at the NCS.
