

## **Metro Justice F.A.Q. Sheet**

**Q: Why do I sometimes see Metro Justice listed as “Metro Justice Education Fund” or “Metro Justice Inc.”?**

A: Metro Justice is actually two organizations. Our 501c3 is “Metro Justice Education Fund” and our 501c4 is “Metro Justice Inc.” If you’d like to make tax-deductible contributions, they must be made payable to “Metro Justice Education Fund.”

**Q: When does the Council meet and who is allowed to attend?**

A: The Council meets on the third Monday of each month from 7:00 – 9:00 pm at the Metro Justice Office. Meetings are open to all members. Only elected leaders are allowed to vote during meeting proceedings.

**Q: Where are the Metro Justice offices and community room located?**

A: We’re located at 1115 East Main Street, Rochester, NY 14609, Door #7 of the Hungerford Building. Both offices and the community room are open to members to engage in the work of the organization.
