Michigan's Clean, Renewable and Efficient Energy Standards have created local jobs, reduced harmful air pollution, and lowered costs for ratepayers.

But some legislators are pushing to roll back this progress by eliminating clean energy standards for utilities and increasing costs for those who generate their own energy, through solar or other technologies.



This week, more than 100 of you called and emailed your senators to advocate for an energy policy that puts the well-being of Michiganders ahead of corporate profits.

It is not a stretch to say that your efforts-- along with the coordinated efforts of dozens of ally organizations-- stopped the passage of these disastrous bills ([SB 437 and 438](#))! For now...
