

# SAN DIEGO VOTER INFORMATION 2020



## OCT 5 Vote by Mail (VBM) ballots start arriving!

If you registered by Oct 19th, you will automatically receive a ballot in the mail for the November 3, 2020 Presidential General Election.

## OCT 20 - NOV 3 Same Day Voter Registration NOW OPEN!

If you need to register or re-register, visit the county election office, an early voting location, or a poll to register and vote.

## NOV 3 Election Day

### Check Your Voter Status

Visit [VoterStatus.sos.ca.gov](http://VoterStatus.sos.ca.gov) to check

- If you registered by Oct 19th, you will receive a ballot in the mail.
- If you need to register or re-register, visit the county election office, an early voting location, or a poll.
- You must register if you are a first time voter or re-register if you moved to a different home address, changed your name, or wish to update your political party preference.

### Find an Early Voting Location

- Visit [CaEarlyVoting.sos.ca.gov](http://CaEarlyVoting.sos.ca.gov) to find an early voting location or a ballot drop-off location. You may register and vote at an early voting site. Select San Diego County and input your zip code.

### Find a Poll to Register and Vote

Polls will be open on Nov 3rd between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm. Your polling place location may change between elections. To find your polling place, you may:

### How to Vote by Mail

Fill out your ballot, place it in the envelope provided, seal it, and complete the information required on the envelope. Sign your name like it appears on your driver's license or identification card. You have the following options to turn in your ballot:

- **Mail it to the Registrar of Voters** - Must be postmarked on or before Nov 3rd and received by the county elections office by Nov 20th. Drop it in any USPS Collection Blue Box.
- **Return it in Person** - Bring it to any polling place between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm on Nov 3rd. Or bring it to the SD County Election Office by 8:00 pm on Nov 3rd.
- **Drop it in a Ballot Drop Box** - Must be delivered by the close of polls at 8:00 pm on Nov 3rd. There are 3 locations listed on your envelope. You may also access a list at [bit.ly/2020BallotDropOff](http://bit.ly/2020BallotDropOff)
- **Authorize someone to return it on your behalf** - Fill out the authorization section on the outside of your ballot envelope. Anyone may return your ballot for you, as long as they do not get paid on a per ballot basis.

**SIGN UP** to receive automatic text, email, or voice call notifications on the status of your vote-by-mail ballot at [california.ballottrax.net](http://california.ballottrax.net)

**IT IS SAFE** All valid vote-by-mail ballots are counted in every election in California, regardless of the outcome or closeness of any race.
