I am running for Huntington Town Supervisor, and I appreciate you taking the time to learn more about my candidacy and vision for Huntington's future. I joined the U.S. Marine Corps (res.) when I was 17 years old, shipping out to boot camp two days after graduating high school. For the past 24 years, I have practiced law on Main Street in Huntington Village. In 2017, I ran and won a seat on the Huntington Town Board. I am currently serving on the Town Board and as Deputy Supervisor.

I am humbled to be running alongside Sal Ferro, Dr. David Bennardo, and Andre Sorrentino, three very accomplished individuals. As a unified team, we will protect Huntington's taxpayers.

I am very proud of what we have accomplished in my first term as a Town Councilman. With bipartisan support, we resolved the decades-long LIPA fiasco that threatened to bankrupt the Town. We enacted term limits for all politicians in Huntington, stopped overdevelopment of apartment buildings in our downtown areas, and revitalized our waterfront with new bulkheads, docks, and a new state-of-the-art rescue boat.

We've invested millions of dollars in badly needed maintenance and upgrades to the sewage treatment plant. We addressed the Town's neglected fleet of garbage trucks, dump trucks, and heavy machinery. This year, we are spending \$435,000.00 on two new garbage trucks, ensuring garbage and recycling pickup remains on schedule. The town's infrastructure is in a better place than it was four years ago; I will continue to make it a budgetary priority. We accomplished all of this, while staying under the tax cap and maintaining a AAA bond rating.

Moving forward, the first order of business is modernizing all departments, making as many services available online as practical, while providing in-person services whenever needed. Town services must be accessible, efficient, and timely. Our first focus will be the Building Department.

Most importantly, the effects of the pandemic will be felt for years to come in our overlooked and underserved communities. The pandemic shed a light on the failings of our social safety net, in particular seniors and children who face food insecurity and minority communities with limited access to basic healthcare. I will strengthen relationships with the Human Services Department and community organizations such as Tri-CYA, Helping Hands Rescue Mission, and the Family Service League to close these gaps.

I am incredibly honored to run for Town Supervisor! I pledge that I will work tirelessly from now until Election Day to earn the right to be your next Town Supervisor. If you desire a fair and measured solutions-driven Town Supervisor, I'm your guy. I value your support and look forward to seeing you and earning your vote.
