Changes to the electoral system mean that you may have lost your vote, without even realising! It is estimated that 1.9million people will drop off the electoral register. Another 8million are not on the register at all. That's not democracy!

That's almost 1 in 5 adults without the vote.

Changes mean that you must sign up as an individual, not as a household.

KEY FACTS:

- As many as 8m people are not on the register already
- Young people are under-represented, with only 25% of 17-year-olds on the register
- Those most likely to be dropping off are young, those living in private rented and shared housing and those for whom English is not their first language

WHY?

- To vote in elections (local, national and EU)
- By being on the register politicians will find it hader to ignore you
- It helps if you are applying for credit (loans, mortgages, mobile phone contracts)
