Money Smart Teen 2018 GREATER ATLANTA



In support of Money Smart Week® 2018, taking place April 21-28, the Money Smart Week® Greater Atlanta planning team and its partner organizations are once again presenting the Money Smart Teen

Contest. Students in high school (grades 9 - 12) are encouraged to answer this year's Money Smart Question (see below) with an essay of at least 350 words but not more than 500 words. A winner will be chosen and required to attend events during the kickoff weekend (see timeline below) beginning with the Money Smart Week® Georgia Kick-Off luncheon on Friday, April 20, 2018 hosted by the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta.

A \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded to the 1st place winner, \$1000 scholarship for 2nd place and \$500 scholarship for 3rd place sponsored by COUNTRY Financial. Additional prizes and categories may be added. The winner will be named "2018 Money Smart Teen" and will spend the year as the Greater Atlanta Money Smart Teen Financial Literacy Ambassador. Winner must be willing and have permission to be photographed, videotaped and make appearances as schedule allows. Winning essay will be featured as a guest post on the new Money Smart Georgia blog and social media platforms.

Please write a brief newspaper article describing the potential devastating effects on a family's financial situation in the event of a natural disaster (fire, flood, hurricane, earthquake, etc.).

Please select only one type of natural disaster for the focus of your article. Be sure to include tips and/ or resources for readers to help them prepare financially for future unexpected crises.

Guidelines

Candidates Must:

- ◆ Be a student in high school (grade 9-12) during the 2017–2018 year.
- ◆ Have knowledge of money management skills (decision-making related to spending and saving, investing, use of credit, etc.) appropriate for their age and grade level
- ◆ Demonstrate how they practice good money management skills in their daily lives
- ◆ Be able to "think on their feet"—responding to questions from business leaders and media
- ◆ Be articulate—able to speak in front of large groups and cameras, and respond well to questions
- ◆ Live in or attend school in the Greater Atlanta area (Butts, Cherokee, Clayton, Cobb, Coweta, Dekalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry, Paulding or Rockdale County).
- ◆ **If selected as a winner, student must be able to attend the kick-off luncheon in Atlanta on Friday, April 20, 2018 and read their essay.**

To Apply

- ◆ Student must be recommended by a teacher using the attached form. (Note: official school sponsorship is not required. Home-schooled children can submit application with parent permission only.)
- ◆ Student must have parent or guardian permission to apply and participate.
- ◆ Student must write an essay (at least 350 words but not more than 500 words) on the assigned topic.
- ◆ Essays must be typed on plain white paper, double-spaced. The Money Smart Teen Application Form must be attached to the essay pages.
- ◆ The essay must be the work of the student submitting the essay.
- ◆ Student must agree to be interviewed by the MSEC committee and/or sponsor.
- ◆ The application form must be signed by the teacher and a parent/guardian.
- ◆ No teacher may sign more than three recommendations. If doing as a class, submit your best three essays.
