NALEO Educational Fund to Host Naturalization Events Nationwide in Celebration of National Citizenship Month

More than 3.9 million Latino lawful permanent residents are eligible to become citizens

Washington, D.C. – The National Association of Latino Elected and Appointed Officials (NALEO) Educational Fund and partners today announced nationwide efforts to provide lawful permanent residents with assistance with the U.S. citizenship process at events across the country this month. The [events](#) are part of NALEO Educational Fund's U.S. Citizenship Month campaign in April, which is supported by the organization's toll-free national bilingual citizenship hotline 1-888-839-8682. Interested applicants can register for naturalization events by calling the hotline, which is operated from 8 a.m. – 8 p.m. ET out of the NALEO Educational Fund's Los Angeles offices. The hotline is staffed year-round by fully-trained bilingual operators who can answer questions about the naturalization process and the availability of local resources and events.

Citizenship month [workshops](#) will take place in multiple cities nationwide from now through Saturday, April 28, 2018, including: Huntington Park and North Hills (CA), Kissimmee, Jacksonville and Miami (FL), Charlotte (NC), Bronx, Brooklyn and New York (NY), and Houston (TX).

At the workshops and clinics, aspiring New Americans will have the opportunity to meet with organizers, immigration attorneys and volunteers, who will be on-site to provide information and resources that will help eligible lawful permanent residents complete the citizenship process. Held in collaboration with local and national partners like the New Americans Campaign, these events will offer a range of services, including pro-bono legal consultations and assistance with the N-400 application, I-912 fee waiver form, reduced fee request assistance (Form I-942) form, and more.
