A Proclamation**

**WHEREAS,** May 3, 2018 is the 67<sup>th</sup> observance of the National Day of Prayer, highlighting the theme “Pray for America: Unity”, and persons of faith are encouraged to join with others throughout the nation and the U.S. territories in its observance; and

**WHEREAS,** National Day of Prayer has been part of our heritage since it was declared by the Second Continental Congress in 1775, and the United States Congress in 1952 approved a Joint Resolution designating a day each year to pray in our nation; and

**WHEREAS,** the United States Congress, by Public Law 100-307, in 1988, as amended, affirms the setting aside of the first Thursday of May annually as a National Day of Prayer; and

**WHEREAS,** recognizing the love and power of God, we unite with fellow citizens to exercise the freedom we have to gather in prayer and engage in meditation with thankfulness while seeking guidance, provision, protection and purpose for the benefit of every individual and our state as a whole; and

**WHEREAS,** we are especially thankful for those who defend our freedoms, and pray for peace throughout our state, nation, and world.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** I, Philip B. Scott, Governor, do hereby proclaim May 3, 2018 as

**DAY OF PRAYER**

in Vermont.
