PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, in 1951, the United States Congress established an annual Day of Prayer during which Americans of all faiths were encouraged to pause in prayer, thanking God for this land and its people seeking inspiration, strength, guidance, wisdom, courage, direction and comfort; and

WHEREAS, as Americans, we need not shrink from asking for Divine assistance in our continuing efforts to relieve human suffering at home and abroad; to reduce hatred, violence and abuse; to restore families across our land; and

WHEREAS, throughout the history of our Nation, our government has welcomed Divine guidance in its work, while respecting the rich and varied faiths of its citizens -- from patriots and presidents to advocates for justice, our history reflects a strong presence of prayer in American life; and

WHEREAS, America was founded on the principles of religious freedom and liberty for all. By following our own beliefs while respecting the convictions of others, we can strengthen our people and build upon our promise as a State; and

WHEREAS, this year the theme of the National Day of Prayer is, "Pray God's Glory Across the Earth" based on Habakkuk 2:14, "For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord as the waters cover the sea."; and

WHEREAS, on May 7, Americans are invited to join in prayer for our Nation and our states, to give thanks for the men and women of the military who defend freedom, to ask God's protection, and to pray for peace throughout the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bill Lee, Governor of the State of Tennessee, do hereby proclaim May 7, 2020 as

Tennessee's Day of Prayer

and encourage all citizens to join me in this worthy observance.
