Santa Monica	CA	<p>On February 26, 2013, City Council added divestment from fossil fuel companies to the Investment Policy's socially responsible investment guidelines. At the time, the City portfolio did not have any current investments in fossil fuel companies, and no such investments have been made since. However, the Cemetery and Mausoleum Perpetual Care Funds – funds paid by customers at the time of internment held in trust by the City – had approximately 10% of their portfolios invested in fossil fuel companies. Although these funds are not truly City funds, Council is responsible for setting the guidelines for their investment. Investments have followed and continue to follow the City's guidelines for socially responsible investing.
