***Join the NCSA on Sunday, February 26 for our first forum of 2017! We'll be hosting a dialogue on Measure S, an important and complex initiative on the March 7th Los Angeles municipal ballot.***

Measure S, or the Neighborhood Integrity Initiative, was born out of frustration with out-of-scale development and loss of affordable housing in Los Angeles. Among other things, the measure would place a two-year moratorium on development projects seeking an amendment to the General Plan, a practice known as spot-zoning. It would also create a public process to update the General Plan, and prohibit developers from conducting their own environmental impact reports (EIRs). Opponents of the measure say it is ill-conceived and that it will exacerbate the affordable housing crisis. (Read the full text of the measure [here](#).)

There are passionate advocates on both sides of the issue, and it's our goal to help you be informed and prepared when you cast your vote in the March 7th municipal elections. Our panel will feature experts on both sides of the issue, with time for Q&A.

The NCSA has not taken a position on this measure. However, we want to begin a conversation about the interconnectedness of land use and sustainability, as Measure S will have important implications for both.
