Garcetti decision to not reinvest in gas-fired power plants

In February, Mayor Garcetti announced that he would not support reinvestment in gas-fired power plants. This is a huge opportunity to move more quickly toward 100% renewable energy, one of the NCSA's goals, and means we will not be investing in technology that will set us back. Now the NCSA and other organizations will work toward 100% renewable energy through the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power's 100% Renewable Energy Advisory Group.

Climate Emergency Mobilization Department

The City Council's Energy, Climate Change, and Environmental Justice Committee met on March 19 and moved us closer to the establishment of a Climate Emergency Mobilization Department. This is an exciting step in an effort led by Councilmember Paul Koretz's office and representatives of frontline communities in Los Angeles.
