#### LA is a Cool City Challenge winner!

With your help, Los Angeles has been selected as one of three Cool City Challenge winners that will be awarded \$1 million, in addition to support for the Cool Blocks program and other efforts to achieve carbon neutrality by 2030. Irvine and Petaluma are the other winning cities. City council passed a motion asking **each neighborhood** 

**council to provide 2 Cool Block leaders**, and we will continue recruiting even after we begin working with the first cohort in January, so please continue to spread the word!

### Peer-to-peer car-sharing and electric vehicle access

The **transportation committee's** proposal to study **car-sharing** was accepted by a group of students in the **UCLA Luskin School of Public Affairs** for their Applied Policy Project capstone. Thank you to everyone on the committee who has worked on this and to **Sheryl Thurston Rosenbaum** for writing the proposal and leading the effort! Our goal is to promote peer-to-peer car-sharing to increase equity, increase electric vehicle access, and decrease pollution exposure in low-income communities.

### Moving toward 100% renewable energy

In case you missed our discussion at the **Congress of Neighborhoods** (with **Alex Jasset, Loraine Lundquist, Ashkan Nassiri, Fred Pickel,** and **Sammy Roth**) about how we can get to 100% **renewable energy**, you can check it out <u>here</u>.

The Department of Water and Power's Strategic Long-Term Resource Plan Advisory Group has been convened to review the steps needed to get us to 100% renewable energy. Our two representatives in the group, energy committee chair Dan Kegel and energy committee member Ravi Sankaran, will keep us posted!

#### Some steps forward, some steps back...

- The <u>California Public Utilities Commission voted unanimously to increase the</u>
  <u>amount of gas stored at the **Aliso Canyon** facility after years of efforts to shut it
  down. How is it that we are going in the wrong direction?</u>

- Following the 2020 census, we have gone through a grueling **redistricting** effort that is wrapping up. Click <u>here</u> for the latest proposal.
- The <u>California legislature passed a law facilitating the end of gas-powered leaf</u> blowers, likely leading to a collective sigh of relief across the entire

neighborhood council system. We have a long way to go, but this is a big step in the right direction.
