It was quite a year -- one that none of us anticipated or would want to repeat. We adapted our work plans and persevered during the global pandemic, and continue to do so, knowing that we had the confidence and backing of our loyal supporters to sustain and encourage us.

One thing the pandemic clearly brought to bear is that there's still work to be done educating the public on how to take care of these public lands. Increasing numbers of people sought out wild lands, many of whom didn't appear to understand Leave No Trace or Pack It In, Pack It Out. Some of our Wilderness areas were overwhelmed with the surge of new visitors.

Our expanded 2020 Annual Report highlights some of our accomplishments during a challenging time and acknowledges our unwavering supporters so vital to our continuing work of Wilderness stewardship, advocacy and outreach, including:

- Successfully defended the **Desert National Wildlife Refuge** from military expansion
- Completed the rebuild of the Griffith Peak Trail in the Mt. Charleston Wilderness
- Continued the "rewilding" of Sheldon National Wildlife Refuge by removing 3.5 tons of metal trash
- Maintained and improved 42.3 miles of Wilderness trails to enhance public access
- Removed 17,748 invasive plants
- Designed and published the Ruby Crest National Recreation Trail Map

We are so very fortunate to have such a caring community of friends and supporters, especially so as we all faced unprecedented challenges. Thanks to people like you, Friends of Nevada Wilderness continued to be the leading voice for Wilderness in Nevada.

Program Highlights of 2020

Stopped military expansion into Desert National Wildlife Refuge!

Re-opened the Mt. Charleston Wilderness Griffith Peak Trail after several years of hard trail work! Knocked down 69 obsolete mining claim markers in a Wilderness Study Area saving countless birds from death.

Monitored 94 springs in Clark County

Maintained about 43 miles of trail - improving public access in the Mt. Charleson, High Schells, Ruby Mountains, Table Mountain, and LaMadre Mountain Wilderness areas.

Removed 3.5 tons of metal trash helping to re-wild the Sheldon National Wildlife Refuge.

Outdoor Outreach Goes Online

#DontBombTheBighorn Webinar -

On July 9th, we hosted and moderated a timely event to garner grassroots action to support protection for the Desert National Wildlife Refuge in Congress with NDAA threats looming. The webinar included panelists from National Wildlife Refuge Association, Defenders of Wildlife, Nevada Wildlife Federation, Las Vegas Paiute member, and Veterans for Peace. Over 4,000 participated or watched the webinar.

Black Rock Rendezvous -

A week of evening programming centered on the Black Rock Desert. Total public participation was over **7,500**.

Artown Gallery -

Twelve wildlife and wildland artists participated and **hundreds** of people browsed the virtual gallery this year.

Dark Skies Star Party -

Basin and Range Dark Sky Cooperative party at **100%** Zoom capacity and **1,000** people viewed on Facebook Live promoting dark sky tourism in rural counties.

Wild Speaker Series —

Over **350** attendees and **11,000**+ public views of the 12 presentations, 8 of which were virtual.

Wild & Scenic Film Festival —

Online live broadcast enabling people from all over Nevada and the U.S. to participate with **43** live attendees and over **200** total participants.

Kid's Corner -

Created web-based resource to help children and their families with their studies especially while home from school during the 2020 Pandemic lockdown.


