Computer Literacy with Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS)

This course provides participants with a strong foundation in computerized business office skills with an emphasis on Microsoft Office.

The curriculum also includes keyboarding, business writing, business math, customer service, and personal and professional development workshops. Applications, resumes, cover letters, thank you letters, and interviewing strategies are also be covered. Training is provided on how to get and keep a job.

High School Equivalency (HSE)

This course focuses on basic skills development by identifying skill deficiencies, providing instruction, and testing for competencies. The curriculum is linked to

the five subject areas of the HSE exam. Students are expected to achieve acceptable scores on the HSE.

Next Step Program (NSP)

NSP is a reentry program targeting individuals who have histories of incarceration and/or substance abuse. The primary goal is to assist such individuals with the transition from the New Jersey Department of Corrections system back to a productive role in their communities. In addition to the academic coursework, participants attend life skills sessions aimed at addressing the issues and barriers associated with reentry, as well as individual counseling sessions. The NSP provides a network of personal and educational services during the first college semester to assist participants in transitioning back into the community.

Cobblestone Multimedia (Cobblestone)

Cobblestone recognizes the entertainment industry's untapped potential as an educational career pathway and professional economic resource for young people in urban areas. To that end, Cobblestone has created a vocational training program that introduces urban youth to the entertainment industry and prepares them for professional employment as well as additional educational opportunities. Garden State Urban Farms (GSUF) - This hydroponic farming program located in Newark, NJ provides training, educational opportunities and transferable job skills for the general population as well as the traditionally difficult-to-employ populations, including the formerly incarcerated.

Hydroponic Farming - This twelve week course is designed to introduce students to Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA) that will serve as a foundation of knowledge for pursuing employment in the agriculture, horticulture, greenhouse, and urban farming industries. The course includes plant physiology, plant nutrition, environmental conditioning, and various systems and methodologies of plant production.

Voting Rights

Individuals convicted of a felony are ineligible to vote while incarcerated, on parole, or on probation in the state of New Jersey. Voting rights are automatically restored upon completion of sentence but people convicted of a felony must re-register to vote. People who are incarcerated for a misdemeanor or civil matter may register to vote and vote from jail by requesting a mail-in ballot.
