

little know miracle occurred last year. Oregon's Governor, John Kitzhaber, signed a proclamation declaring April 1996 as Christian Heritage Month. He encouraged "all Oregonians to join in the observance." This was the first time in U.S. history an entire month had been set aside for the acknowledgement of our Christian heritage.

This proclamation was miraculous for many reasons. First, Oregon is one of two states with the least number of Christians per capita, and second, it's one of the most politically liberal states in the nation.

Since the 1996 proclamation, the Governor's Attorney General's Office alledged Christian Heritage Month as unconstitutional and offensive to some Oregonians. Yet, in comparison, the Governor signed proclamations in 1995 and again in 1996 declaring October as GAY AND LESBIAN HISTORY MONTH! Bowing to liberal interests, he refuses to sign another proclamation for a 1997 Christian Heritage Month.

In response, Oregon's legislature has drafted their own proclamation endorsing Christian Heritage Month.

This is an opportunity for the Christian community to share our rich Christian history with youth as well as adults, who may not be aware of the impact Christianity has had on the formation of our nation.

American History: Useless or Useful?

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I enrolled in the night class and at the end of the course I barely passed. Again, I showed little interest in the subject. I had a poor attitude. I was naive. I believed History was useless in real life. I thought, why waste time learning about dead people and boring events of the past? What did History have to do with me?

Since those high school years, my attitude about learning has changed. Two years ago, at the age of 29, I attended a seminar about America's Christian History. There I learned the importance formal education and learning have had in creating the freest nation on earth. While there was no 40-pound rock hall pass preventing me from leaving the lecture, there didn't need to be. This time I wasn't looking for a way to skip out of class. For the first time in my life, I saw how important learning the truth about our nation past was.

What is History?

History is more than merely memorizing names of the dead, what they accomplished and when they did so. It is the truth about how our nation was founded. Knowledge of our history protects us from a world system that rewrites (changes) history and is anti-Christ. Today, there are truths of History being intentionally withheld from high school History classes.

Christ-Centered Beginning

In their Mayflower Compact, the pilgrims in 1620 clearly stated they came to America "...for the advancement of the Christian faith..." Is this mentioned in class? The Mayflower Compact which was a document of government, was also a profession of Christian faith. For more than 150 years, the clergy provided leadership by preaching and teaching Biblical principles of government from the pulpit as well as in their elec-

tion speeches at the seats of colonial civil government. The Word of God became the American political textbook.

Pilgrims travelled from England to the New World for the advancement of the Christian faith. And in continuing that heritage, 106 of the first 108 schools in America were founded on Biblical principles. Harvard University, established in 1636 by John Harvard, a Pastor from England, stated in it's Rules and Precepts:

"Let every student be plainly instructed, and earnestly pressed to consider well, the main end of his life and studies is, to Know God and Jesus Christ which is eternal life, John 17:3 and therefore to lay Christ in the bottom, as the only foundation of all sound Knowledge and Learning."

When was the last time you were taught at your high school that Jesus Christ was and is the foundation of all sound knowledge and learning?

Yale College, founded in 1701, was declared to be an institution where:

"Youth may be instructed in the Arts and Sciences who through the blessing of Almighty God may

Founding Fathers

Americans today properly exalt George Washington as Father of his country, admire Thomas Jefferson as the author of the Declaration of Independence and honor James Madison as the Father of the Constitution, yet most Americans overlook another great Founder. One of the youngest and most brilliant of them all, Noah Webster was the Father of American Education. Oh you rem'ember Noah Webster. He's the man who compiled the first truly American dictionary. In the preface of his original 1828 dictionary he wrote:

"In my view, the Christian religion is the most important and one of the first things in which all children, under a free government ought to be instruct-

ed...No truth is more evident to my mind than that the

Christian religion must be the basis of any government intended to secure the rights and privileges of free people."

He also stated that

"Education is useless without the Bible."

Is that true? Is education truly useless without the Bible?

"Beware lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and empty deceit, according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ."

- Colossians 2:8

Noah Webster held a Biblical world view. When you learn things like this, history comes alive because God is right smack in the middle of it! The same is true for every subject (see Colossians 1:18 and 2:3).

Be Mindful of Core Principles

I've to come to see (especially now as a Christian) why I did so poorly in high school. The core principles of subjects—especially history—had been removed from the curriculum. Their education methods didn't inspire me to love learning. I'd been instructed in a philosophy of education that was centered on man and not on God.

WCFC: Alison, you've been at Madison for over three years. I'd like you to share your perspective—

as a Christian—on what it's been like attending a public high school knowing that the environment is not very conducive to a Christian walk.

ALISON: Well, our environment is definitely not conducive to being a Christian at all. It's just a very worldly place, and it's difficult to keep yourself

from reflecting the world because you're around it all the time. It's so easy to slip and fall into sin everyday. We also have problems with Satanists.

> WCFC: Tell me about the satanism activity that's been going on at Madison.

ALISON: Yes, there are quite a few satanists at our school. But it's not like they're running around screaming "Satan rules!" or anything like that. They're much more subtle. They're a presence there, but it's not, really vocal.

> WCFC: Okay, when you say they have a presence there, you know that because of the fact you're a Christian. Do those students who don't know God know that there is an evil presence?

> > ALISON:: It depends on the person's sensitivity to these things. It seems that everyone knows the satanists are there, but they don't worry about it.

WCFC: Well Alison, with you being a Christian at Madison High School at the same time there are students who are satanist, how do you see yourself and any role you may have before God.

ALISON: The only thing that I can see doing for the most

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part is praying about it because it's spiritual warfare. That and just loving the people.

WCFC: Outstanding! Let's talk a bit now about your Bible club. Give us some history about the club.

ALISON: It was started about five years ago, and the club met in the cafeteria. The club started out with five students and now has somewhat of a steady attendance of about 15. Right now we're trying to find someone who'll be the student leader for next school year, but it's been a difficult task to find someone who is committed.

WCFC: What do you see the purpose of the club being?

ALISON: To be a refuge for Christians. To build each other up and pray for each other and pray for our school.

WCFC: Has the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution been quoted erroneously to you against your freedoms in this area?

ALISON: Yes. It always is by those who are not familiar with the First Amendment. People misquote it by stating it mentions a "separation between church and state." All they have to do is just read it instead of hearing what someone else said it says.

WCFC: Do you see some of the same kind of twisted truth coming through some of the other subjects being taught in your classes?

ALISON: Yes, and except in the case of the 'Great Awakening,' Christianity is basically shown in negative light, which was, in a lot of ways, the push for our revolution. It gets like two sentences in the history text-book.

WCFC: We hear a lot of talk about revival. You know that this ministry has taken up the call to promote revival among youth. It takes time because you're usually working with small numbers. Over the last couple of years at Madison, I've seen you as the Bible club student leader who wants to awaken things there. Do you think revival is possible in the public schools in the context of a revival of truth?

ALISON: The truth will always prevail. The very fact we have Bible clubs in the schools where five or ten years ago there weren't, says to me that we're moving in the direction of revival and that God is setting something up. Although (today) we don't have anywhere near the amount of people to do the ministry it would take to disciple all the newly-revived Christians.

WCFC: You've just made a very important observation. You basically said we have a problem here: we can't afford to have revival because if we did we'd be inundated with the workload. What do you think the solution is?

ALISON: For one thing, we need a lot more understanding of the Bible. There are not enough youth pastors in the world to take care of all the kids. We need to understand the power of God and how to use it. And we need to understand the authority we have in Christ Jesus so we can minister to people.

WCFC: What would you like to leave with those who read this interview?

ALISON: Two things actually. One, you need to pray. Prayer works. And secondly, get into the Word and get an understanding of it. If you're having problems understanding the Bible, then you need to talk to your parents or your youth pastor. There is someone out there who can help you. Oh, and also stop going to sleep at church. Pay attention. That's good stuff!
