NUS Launches Education Quality Survey

Today the National Union of Students will launch the 2015 Education Quality Survey at the University of South Australia as a part of our Demand A Better Future Campaign.

This is a survey to capture a snap shot of students experiences in the quality of their teaching and learning. It is the only student run student experience survey in Australia.

NUS president Rose Steele said students are seriously concerned about the quality of their education and teaching with the rise of caualised teaching and flexible learning such as lectorials and the move to online learning.

We are at a critical juncture for education in 2015 where students are facing an uncertain future and could be paying more than 100k for their degrees under the threat of deregulation by a Minister that received a free education.

Cuts to funding and the underfunded system will compromise the quality of education and will mean fewer courses and support at university.

The NUS Quality survey has been run in 2010 and 2012 and again this year – this survey was designed to track the effects of a deregulated demand driven system and student experiences of quality of teaching and learning at our nations universities under the changing nature of federal funding.
