

TIMOR-LESTE PROGRAMS DIRECTOR



The International Engagement Portfolio is responsible for managing Oaktree's engagement in our partner countries: Timor-Leste and Cambodia. We partner with local organisations to deliver innovative development projects with a focus on youth empowerment and capacity-building, and youth participation. The portfolio also oversees Oaktree's grants and philanthropy work, and domestic political engagement.

As the Timor-Leste Programs Director, you are responsible for Oaktree's strategy and partnerships in Timor-Leste. You report directly to the Head of International Engagement, and sit on the International Engagement Leadership Team and Oaktree's Extended Leadership Team.

As the Timor-Leste Programs Director, a typical day might look like:

- Skyping with our in-country partner organisation to oversee the development and implementation of Oaktree's youth empowerment project in Timor-Leste, including financial and project management, and monitoring and evaluation;
- Planning an in-country evaluation or capacity-building trip;
- Designing innovative funding strategies and outlining options for new partnerships with grassroots youth organisations in Timor-Leste;
- Producing research articles on partnerships, projects or project processes;
- Establishing relationships and collaborating with other practitioners working for social change in Timor-Leste;

- Time commitment: 20-25 hours per week (flexible arrangements can be made).

This is a voluntary position and may include occasional weekend retreats or international travel. Anticipated start date: Tuesday 8th October 2019
