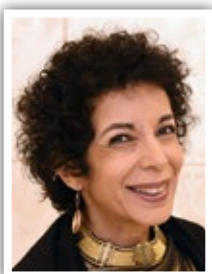
Senator Kim Pate

Senator Kim Pate is a nationally renowned advocate who was the executive director of the Canadian Association of the Elizabeth Fry Society supporting some of the most marginalized, victimized, criminalized and institutionalized. In April 2020, Senators Kim Pate and Frances Lankin spearheaded an open letter from 50 senators to the Prime Minister on a nation-wide guaranteed livable income program.
