

Property Tax Solution for Long Time, Low Income Homeowners

What are we proposing?

A new property tax assistance program that would prevent the displacement of long time, low income Raleigh and Wake County homeowners. This would be a grant program similar to tax assistance programs recently passed in Durham and Mecklenburg.

Key Elements of Proposal

Homeowners who earn up to 80% of the area median income, and who have lived in their home for at least 10 years, will pay no more than 2% of their total household income on property taxes.

The Unequal Impact of Rising Property Taxes

Neighborhoods in Raleigh are not being impacted by property taxes at the same rate.

Property tax increase in Walnut Terrace, South Raleigh:

151%

Property tax increase in the Glenwood South neighborhood:

32%

Incomes are not keeping up with the rise in property taxes:

For example, in South Park property taxes increased by **125%** but household income increased only by **15%**.
