Who would improvements to employment laws directly affect?

Population

In the Windsor Census Metropolitan Area (CMA), the number of persons of working age, 15 years of age and over was estimated in 2006, to be 270,000. A decade later, in 2016 Windsor's population has increased by 10,800 and is now estimated to be 280,800.¹

Employment

In the Windsor CMA, the number of persons employed in 2006, was estimated to be 165,500. By 2016, that number had decreased by 8,900 and is currently estimated to be 156,600.


Income Distribution

How equally is income distributed?

In 2010, the median income in the Windsor CMA was \$28,924 with males earning \$36,664 and females earning \$23,705.

In 2010, the average annual income for individuals in the Windsor CMA was \$37,971, with males earning \$45,172 and females earning \$31,071.
