


Overnight installation of sewage system monitors along the Ontario Line

Beginning February 24, 2021



What is happening?

To advance design concepts and other structural plans for the Ontario Line, Metrolinx will be installing sewage system monitors at locations along the Ontario Line, in order to understand how the sewer system behaves during wet weather. Using this information, Metrolinx can determine the optimal construction approach for this project.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Work to install the monitors will be taking place around manholes and underground in the sewage system where the equipment will be installed to be left in place for up to 6 months.
- When installation and maintenance is taking place, fencing will be put in place on sidewalks and portions of sidewalks may be closed.
- During work hours, some lane reductions may be required and traffic will be diverted. Paid duty police officers will be present at some locations to assist with traffic control.
- Please take care when walking near construction areas. Watch for additional signs directing pedestrians, as detours may be required.

TIMING

- The installation of monitors will begin on February 24 and is expected to last up to three days. **The installation of monitors will occur between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.** on weekdays only.
- Installation will take up to an hour and a half at each site.
- Work crews will return on a monthly basis to each site for maintenance.
- The monitors will be left in place for up to 6 months after which the field crew will return to remove them.
- Work could be rescheduled and delayed due to weather conditions or any unforeseen circumstances.

MONITORING LOCATIONS

February 24-25:

- Strachan Avenue near Wellington Street West
- Fleet Street near Strachan Avenue
- Atlantic Avenue near Liberty Street
- Ordnance Street near Strachan Avenue
- King Street West near Bathurst Street - Sidewalk detours can be expected
- Queen Street East near Carlaw Avenue
- Gerrard Street East near Carlaw Ave
- Pape Avenue near Gerrard Street East
- Pape Avenue near Lipton Avenue
- Pape Avenue near Hopedale Avenue - Sidewalk detours can be expected

February 25-26:

- Richmond Street West near Spadina Avenue
- Queen Street West near Peter Street
- Simcoe Street near Richmond Street West
- Bay Street near Richmond Street West
- Yonge Street near Queen Street East - Sidewalk detours can be expected
- Queen Street East near Sherbourne Street
- King Street East near Berkeley Street
- Eastern Avenue near Bayview Avenue
- Thorncliffe Park Drive near Overlea Boulevard
- Grenoble Drive near Gateway Boulevard
- Seton Park Road near Ferrand Drive
