We the undersigned petition the Legislative Assembly of Ontario as follows: to immediately engage in conversations with the City of Windsor, the Federal government, and Parks Canada to establish this Urban Park to protect this vital 900-acre greenspace, to sign an agreement with Parks Canada to transfer Ojibway Prairie Provincial Nature Reserve to Parks Canada, and respectfully work with and support local Indigenous peoples such as the Caldwell First Nation to ensure accountability and transparency in the establishment and management of ONUP.
