### LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

#### **Dear Pawsitivity supporters,**

Despite 2020's challenges, Pawsitivity has done great things this year, and we couldn't have done them without your support.

1 NEW BOARD MEMBER. In 2020, moved by the Black Lives Matter movement, we pledged to make our personnel more diverse. In that vein, Pawsitivity elected a highly qualified new board member, Dr. Sergio Valverde, who is a person of color.



2 NEW EMPLOYEES. Pawsitivity didn't stop there. In 2020, we:

- Hired dog trainer Ray Nichols, a disabled Black veteran, to head our new Black Veterans program.
- Hired Frannie Kass, a person of color who is a former client of Pawsitivity, as our Education Manager.

3 SERVICE DOGS TRAINED FREE OF CHARGE. Because of Daniel Maltz's generous 2019 donation, given to "support the training of service dogs or to provide financial assistance for individuals who lack the funds to acquire a service dog," Pawsitivity chose to train three service dogs free of charge.

3 NEW PUPPIES. In a pilot program, Pawsitivity has started training three puppies as service dog candidates.

The budget for 2021 dedicates a salary of \$31,400 for staff member Julie Coleman. Thank you for your continued support!

"Pawsitivity Service Dogs changed my son's life by providing Grady, a two-year-old Labrador. My son went from being a child afraid to leave his house to a confident boy playing sports, going to school, and making lots of friends who wanted to meet Grady, his best friend that kept him safe and went everywhere with him. Grady became a lifesaver to our entire family because when he was off duty and at our home Jude's siblings could play with him and give him lots of cuddles. He, without a doubt, was life-changing for me because he takes the night shift of watching my son and sleeping next to him so that I can get a full night's rest. We collectively wonder what we ever did before Grady came along because he is my son's guardian angel. This year a German Shepherd was off leash and came at my three kids to attack them. Grady stood his ground, refusing to move or back down, absorbing all of the vicious attack and wounds while standing in front of my boys to keep them safe. So actually he's my whole family's guardian angel. Julie and Tom who run Pawsitivity are always checking in on my son Jude and on Grady, and they're always a phone call or text away to offer guidance, love and support. There aren't enough words to articulate how much Pawsitivity saved our lives and what Grady has meant to my young son. My son has endured many painful surgeries, and before Grady he was generally frightened of a world that had shown him nothing but pain and anguish. Grady gave us back our lives and allowed my son to see all the beauty that the world is full of.

In many ways, Grady saved all of us."


### **SUNSHINE**

Also pictured is the German Shepherd service dog who was with their daughter when she passed away.




#### SPECIAL DONATION

### **AUSTRALIA**

We held a special fundraiser in early 2020 to help wildlife affected by the Australian wildfires, donating 100% of these gifts to AWARE Australia, the World Wildlife Fund, Wildlife Victoria, and the World Wide Fund For Nature – Australia.

# BLACK DISABLED VETERANS PROGRAM

Pawsitivity held two special fundraisers this year to benefit Black veterans with service dogs. We donated 100% of these gifts to Ray Nichols, a Black disabled U.S. military veteran, to head our new Black Veterans service dog program.



#### TRANSPARENCY AND ACCOUNTABILITY

### **CPA REVIEW**

For the fifth straight year, Pawsitivity's financials have been reviewed by CPA Stewart R. Curtis of the MHA Tax Group, who noted during the review that "the financials are in good order and straightforward."

### CHARITIES REVIEW COUNCIL APPROVAL

Pawsitivity once again completed the tri-annual Accountability Wizard® nonprofit review and passed with flying colors, thus earning the Charities Review Council seal of approval.

#### **GUIDESTAR PLATINUM**

Once again, Pawsitivity has earned Guidestar's Platinum status, which includes new reporting requirements.

### IMPACT EVALUATION

As we reported last year, Pawsitivity went above and beyond Guidestar's requirements by publishing our own independent, third-party Impact Evaluation. As of 2021, Pawsitivity is still the only U.S. service dog organization to do so.

### **DANDY**

Service dog Dandy (nicknamed after donor Daniel Maltz) graduated with his handler in the spring of 2020 (free of charge). Dandy was our first greyhound rescue.

Fun fact: Usually greyhounds are ex-racing dogs, but Dandy was the rare dog who was raised from a puppy to be a service dog and was donated to Pawsitivity as an adult.

## **TOBY**

Service dog Toby graduated in 2020 (free of charge) and is now assisting his handler, who has multiple physical disabilities and is confined to a wheelchair. Toby's woman and her husband have been enthusiastic supporters of Pawsitivity for years, including helping us train service dog Lee in 2017.

### **AUGGIE**

2020's COVID-19 pandemic required flexibility, and Pawsitivity rose to the challenge by instituting a new program where Pawsitivity trainers worked directly with a client and their dog (free of charge) through weekly socially distanced in-person sessions and multiple online check-ins.

With this program, Pawsitivity was able to work with aspiring dog trainer Hannah, pictured here with her new Pawsitivity service dog, Auggie.






#### **EDUCATION**

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Pawsitivity's presentations to the public were all virtual this year. Pawsitivity staff gave Zoom presentations to first graders (who also got to color in Pawsitivity's free coloring book that illustrates how service dogs help people) and also to federal employees who wanted to donate through the Combined Federal Campaign. Pawsitivity was certified for the Combined Federal Campaign with the help of a grant from the Workplace Giving Alliance.

Pawsitivity staff continues to learn as well as teach. This year's continuing education classes included online CATCH webinars and the first part of an Animal Assisted Play Therapy (AAPT) workshop. While the inperson portions of the AAPT event have been postponed from 2020 to 2021, we were able to do the homework and the online coursework.

A - Pawsitivity received five donor-designated donations in 2020, totaling \$50,987:

A1 - A one-time gift of \$20,750 from the family of a previous Pawsitivity service dog recipient, designated for training a service dog in memory of their son.

A2 - A one-time gift of \$20,000 from the Robert and Helen Renwick Charitable Foundation Trust, designated for training a service dog for a veteran (in memory of their daughter).

A3 - A recurring \$5,000 gift from the JA Wedum Foundation, designated for training a service dog for a veteran.

A4 - At the beginning of the year, we held a special fundraiser dedicated to helping wildlife affected by the Australian wildfires. Pawsitivity raised \$4,737, and Pawsitivity donated 100% of these gifts to AWARE Australia, the World Wildlife Fund, Wildlife Victoria, and the World Wide Fund For Nature - Australia.

A5 - This year, we held two fundraisers to benefit Black veterans with service dogs. Pawsitivity raised \$900, and Pawsitivity donated 100% of these gifts to Ray Nichols, a Black disabled U.S. military veteran who is a Certified Master Dog Trainer from the Catch Canine Dog Training Academy, to head our new Black Veterans service dog program. The program is dedicated to training service dogs for a traditionally underserved population, Black U.S. military veterans who are disabled.




