### **Kwantlen First Nation and Langley Residents Rally to Oppose Local Pipeline Development**

**WHAT:** Kwantlen First Nation and Langley residents opposed to the Kinder Morgan Trans Mountain Expansion Project will rally on Thursday afternoon near the site where Kinder Morgan conducted test drilling last weekend next to the Salmon River. There will be a traditional welcome, opening remarks by a Kwantlen First Nation member, speeches by dignitaries, and drumming at the event. The event is meant to draw attention to the project, question the National Energy Board consultation process with First Nations and residents, and raise awareness about the risks from the Trans Mountain Expansion Project to the environment on a local and global scale.

**WHO:** Kwantlen First Nation representatives, Langley residents, and supporters opposed to the Kinder Morgan pipeline development. This event is organized by Brandon Gabriel and Kwantlen First Nation and supported by the PIPE UP Network.
