## RALPH KRUGLER, HILLSBORO LIGHTHOUSE HISTORIAN

Thank you to Ralph Krugler for giving his time to come and speak to us at our May Program. We had an amazing turnout. Ralph had so many stories to share and tales to tell we could have stayed all night. Did you know that the Hillsboro Inlet Light is considered one of the most powerful lights in the world with a beam that extends for 28 nautical miles? That's thanks to the Fresnel Lens (pronounced Fray-nel). The lens was made in Paris, France by Barbier, Bernarn and Turenne. It is nine feet in diameter and weighs 3,600 pounds. The lens itself is made from 356 individual ground glass panels. It is one of only nine Fresnel Lamps active in the US as of 1999.



We hope Ralph will come back and talk to us again. If you haven't yet, or even if you have, you must go and visit the lighthouse on one of its tour days.

## IT'S MANGO SEASON!

In 1910 a new mango tree was born in Mrs. Florence Haden's backyard in Coconut Grove. A 'Turpentine' a fibrous and spicy mango from the Caribbean and the smooth-fleshed and delicate 'Mulgoba' of India - joined together and generated a new generation of mangos. It was named 'Haden'. The Haden mango became popular early on and was the most popular commercially grown mango until World War II. The Haden is still a favorite backyard tree due to its delicious flavor. Other varieties became more popular to grow commercially because they could withstand the rigors of shipping, produced fruit more regularly and were more disease resistant.

From the seeds of 'Haden', came the sweet and spicy 'Kent' of Miami, the pastel-hued 'Keitt' of Homestead, and the gorgeous, firm and productive 'Tommy Atkins' of Fort Lauderdale. As to the identity of the fathers, there exists only conjecture. Many backyards in Pompano have a mango tree, or two. We have a Haden tree, how about you?
