## KAMAR'S STORY

# // Kamar is a beautiful, energetic child with a problem: her heart is dying.

Her mother and father struggle to find the medical help they need to save her life, along with the dedicated doctors of Iraq who labor to save sick children, but the fact is they do not have the resources to do it on their own. The backlog of children waiting in line for a lifesaving surgery is daunting, an appalling symptom of the cycle of violence that unmakes the world and creates divisions among people. Kamar's plight - and potential - compels us to fight for preemptive love in Iraq, no matter the cost.

But, thanks to you, we are not without hope. And neither is Kamar.

There is a Remedy for Iraqi children that claims daily victories even while violence rages around it. It is fueled by the preemptive love of compassionate donors and medical teams around the world, and it has the power to disrupt the cycle of violence and to remake the world through healing.

In April 2013, as part of this Remedy, you funded the first ever Remedy Mission to Tikrit, bringing international teams of skilled doctors to train local medical staff and provide operations to children who had waited their entire lives – including Kamar. You helped forge a new path for the people of Tikrit and you are putting Kamar one step closer to life.

# 2013 HIGHLIGHTS

In 2013, Iraq saw the greatest upsurge in violence since the sectarian conflict in 2008, with an astonishing toll of 8,955 deaths by the end of the year. Amid the renewed violence, most Iraqi doctors would not have the ability to dig in and continue their critical work.

But because of the programs and resources you help provide in Iraq, the doctors we work with have a reason to stay. They are able to continue training, saving lives through surgeries, and working for peace despite the challenges.

Although 2013 was the most violent year since our founding, you and our partners did not waver, but pushed forward with an even stronger response, leading to our most successful year yet.

## THE REMEDY

Our journey to eradicate the backlog of Iraqi children in need of heart surgery began with Aras, a little boy from the war-ravaged town of Halabja.

To give Aras the surgery he needed, we had no option but to send him out of the country. But we, along with many Iraqis, knew we needed a closer, more sustainable solution for the future children of Iraq.


We implemented a daring new plan: Instead of sending families with young children like Aras to other countries, we brought the lifesaving remedy here—to their very neighborhoods.

During these Remedy Missions, international medical teams travel to Iraqi cities to provide treatment for as many children as possible, simultaneously equipping local doctors and nurses with the skills to save countless others.

The hope of a remedy—a local, sustainable solution to the backlog—that began with a little boy from Halabja, grew this year into our 21st Remedy Mission so far. The waging of peace, training of doctors, and saving of lives haven't stopped yet!



# REMEDY MISSIONS



# Q// How do you know when doctors attract attention with the quality of their cardiac care?

A// When families from other countries begin to travel hundreds of miles to seek their services.

That's what happened this year in Basra, Iraq, a city that once lacked medical infrastructure but is now home to a thriving heart center. When PLC and the medical staff in Basra collaborated to perform a Remedy Mission for local children, two families from faraway Kyrgyzstan were also waiting for them. Little Marlin and his mother, along with Jasmine and her grandfather, traveled thousands of miles to Iraq to seek their last chance for a lifesaving surgery. Instead of turning them away, the international and Iraqi doctors stepped out in love to give Marlin and Jasmine the solution they needed.

Preemptive love crosses borders and barriers, recognizing the humanity in everyone. The smiles of these children and the compassion of their doctors remind us of an Iraq that could be a place known for service to others, and not just for suffering.







# REMEDY FELLOWSHIP

While the Remedy Missions are the first steps on the road to sustainably remaking Iraq, the Remedy Fellowship is a giant leap forward. It began with a dream in the heart of Iraqi surgeon, Dr. Akeel, who lost several family members to congenital heart defects and had an audacious desire to remake the healthcare system in his hometown. By 2013, the second full year of the yearlong Fellowship training in Nasiriyah was underway and impacting hundreds of lives. During the program, ICHF medical experts move to Iraq to train Iraqi doctors, nurses, and technicians through lectures, hands-on work in the ICU, and participating in actual surgeries for children. This program, the only one of its kind in Iraq, has exponentially expanded the impact of PLC's work, with local doctors guiding the performance of two surgeries every day for 38 weeks out of the year. This means changed lives for hundreds of children and practical, sustainable steps toward building a future for healthcare in Iraq.



By supporting these men and women in their quest to rebuild the country, you forge strong links of peace across cultural and geographic divides. Without them, and without you, the Coalition would fall apart.



Because of your support and compassion, beautiful little Kamar received a diagnostic catheterization in April, joining Dr. Zainab, Dr. Munaf, Dr. Aso, Marlin, Jasmine, and countless other doctors and children you impacted this year. Kamar's procedure was groundbreaking—she was the first child ever in her region to receive anything like it—and you made it possible.

But our work is not finished yet.

Kamar's mother wept in the hospital when the diagnostics revealed that her daughter needs another procedure to save her heart. Even now, Kamar is still waiting for a lifesaving operation to give her story a happy ending. Many families now know what is wrong with their children, but knowing only adds to their suffering if there is no practical solution in sight.

We are committed to following through on diagnostics by providing the necessary surgeries for Iraqi families, and we do not want Kamar's procedure to be in vain. We need your help to take the next steps for her, and for many children like her.

The violence that keeps people from medical solutions in Iraq continues to rage, but that does not mean the fight for peace is over. Another full year of Remedy Fellowship is already underway, and the Iraqi government has asked for us to expand beyond heart surgery, giving you the opportunity to promote even more transformative change in Iraq.

While still keeping in focus the goal to eradicate the Backlog, we are poised to broaden and deepen the work of peace. It is because you are willing to invest in rough places and partner with local people who are committed to initiatives for change that we, together, can wage peace in Iraq.
