Allowable Uses for each Grant Option

Evidence-based requirement for eligible programs



The **BJA STOP School Violence Threat Assessment and Technology Reporting Program Competitive Grant** option is to be used to enhance school safety through threat assessment, crisis intervention teams, and new technology for reporting systems.

Allowances of this grant option include:

- Training students and staff to identify, assess, and respond to potential threats
- Ensure the security of school property
- Update or implement new reporting systems with notifications and information sharing
- Develop close coordination with law enforcement and trained officials for crisis involvement

The **BJA STOP School Violence Prevention and Mental Health Training Program Competitive Grant** option is to be used to train students and school personnel to prevent school violence and address mental health concerns.

Allowances of this grant option include:

- Educate students and school staff on indications of behaviors that might turn into violence
- Educate students and school staff of indications concerning mental health conditions

Eligibility

1. States
2. Units of Local Government
3. Federally-Recognized Indian Tribes

**Applicants with 2 or more entities, for example local governments, are welcome, but only ONE may be the applicant. Others may be proposed as subgrantees*

**Schools districts can apply, select "Independent School District" on application*

Geographic Distribution of Funding

Category 1

- State with Population Greater Than 5M
- Up to \$1,000,000

Category 2

- State with Population of less than 5M
- Up to \$500,000

Category 3

- Urban Area/Large County with population greater than 500K
- Up to \$500,000

Category 4

- Suburban area/medium-sized county with population between 100-500K
- Up to \$250,000

Category 5

- Rural Area/Small County with population less than 100K
- Up to \$150,000

Category 6

- Federally Recognized Indian Tribe
- Up to \$100,000

Category 7 (Technology & Anonymous Reporting)

- No Population Requirement
- *Only for anonymous reporting*
- Up to \$200,000
