Sandy Hook Promise's no-cost *Know the Signs* programs teach youth and adults how to identify, intervene and get help for individuals **before** they hurt themselves or others.

Safety Assessment and Intervention



Safety Assessment and Intervention (SAI) teaches a multi-disciplinary school teams within a school district how to identify, assess, and respond to threats of violence or at-risk behavior before a tragedy takes place. The *SAI* training is appropriate for schools of all grades. The *SAI* program specifically trains multi-disciplinary teams to:

- 1) identify threats, signs and signals leading to a violent act
- 2) determine the seriousness of the threat, sign or signal and
- 3) develop intervention plans that protect potential victims as well as address the underlying problem or conflict that initiated the behavior.

SAVE Promise Clubs



Sandy Hook Promise encourages the establishment and implementation of *SAVE (Students Against Violence Everywhere) Clubs*. *SAVE Promise Clubs* are student-led and committed to stopping violence before it happens.

The Four Step Process



School leadership organizes a multi-disciplinary team of key teachers and staff who receive *SAI* training.

Before the training, the team reviews the school's current safety plan.

A certified Sandy Hook Promise presenter conducts the *SAI* eight-hour training for multi-disciplinary teams.

2



The multi-disciplinary teams implement the *SAI* model within their school, where they will identify, assess, and respond to threats of violence.

3



Schools establish a *SAVE Promise Club* to implement activities and events that promote stopping violence before it happens.
