What are your priorities for public services in our communities?

Healthcare, Dental service, Reduction of rent, electricity, gas, water, garbage and sewage. Equipment for the disabled.

What is your position on private-public partnerships?

I have nothing against such a partnership. We live under one roof, and we must support and help each other.

What are your priorities for transportation?

Continued expansion of metro, electric and hybrid buses in the city. It all depends on the size of the settlements and population. Mixed and more traffic in the districts, less traffic in the city. Determine who can pass through the city. If we allowed each type of transport to pass through our city, there would always be traffic jams.

Do you support the change in campaign financing laws?

I don't see the need to change anything, the only exception, donations for the campaign should be deducted from taxes.

People do not want to help candidates because they know that they will not get anything in return.

What is your plan to address housing and homelessness in our communities?

We need to look more closely at the institutions that distribute social housing or flats. My application with CRHC (Capital Region Housing Corporation) has been for 12 years, Homed for 4 years, Habitat for humanity for 8 years, and 3 others for 5 years. There are 47,000 social homes and flats in Edmonton. Some people live for up to 14 years and their economic situation has never improved. The city should establish a commission of at least 3 people to investigate why some applicants wait many years, and some are served immediately. Why some people never improved their living conditions and a social flat is rented by a taxi driver.



Public Interest Alberta

Two and a half million people and low-income families currently live in Alberta. Many of these people cannot pay the bills on time. It's time to end this. If this situation lasts longer, we can expect a humanitarian catastrophe.

As long as the system produces low-income individuals and families, I am in favor of building social homes, flats and small low-cost homes on a large scale.

As a city councillor, I will be the first to show other councillors how to raise funds quickly for this entire project. We will get the money quickly and build houses quickly. Thanks to my idea, we will immediately stop this entire slow housing bureaucratic machine. I will give people a rest and a home.

What are your priorities to address the fiscal relationship between the provincial government and municipalities?

They should be complementary. If the provincial government cannot do something, the city will help and vice versa.

Both sides should remember that Edmonton is not just a city but the capital of the province of Alberta.
