

TABLE TALK NOTE-TAKING

The Question:

We invite you to share a story of a pressure on you or your family that's about:

- Real Jobs and/or Climate Justice. OR
- Safety and Connection in your community. OR
- If these aren't relevant, what is another pressure that you care about?

Tips for Note-Taking

Use the template in this document to take notes.

These are public stories – they are treated with respect but they aren't confidential. We need to take notes to see what we have in common and be able to move to collective action.

In your table talk notes you're looking for 3 things:

1. Powerful Stories:.

For each person we want to record the basic elements of their story. It should be written as a story, not a summary of issues or case note. Make sure to include:

- What pressure were they encountering?
- Who do we need to know to understand the story?
- When and where did this story happen?
- What was their response to the pressure?

2. Potential Leaders:

You often see a different side of people in this setting. In their story have they encountered and overcome problems? Do they bring other people with them? Tick the box if you think they are a potential leader.

3. Commitment to Action:

Its <u>essential</u> to ask if people want to take action together. The note-taker's role is to make sure that gets recorded. Read the instructions on p12 before you start.
