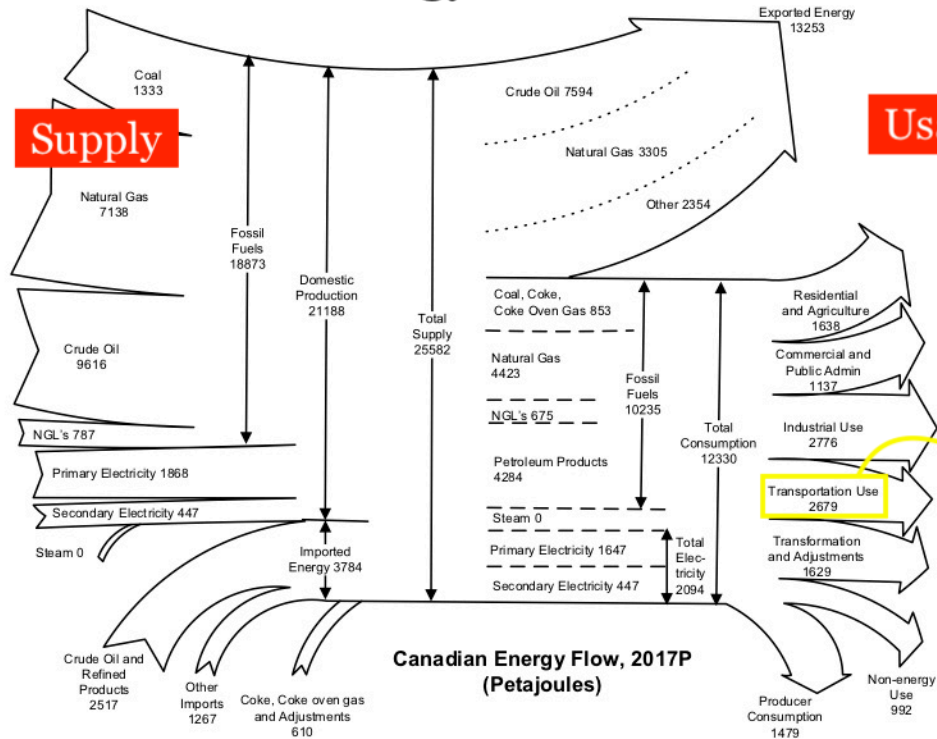


The flow of Canadian energy, 2017

Canada's total energy production rose 5% over 2016, with crude oil the largest share (46.4% of total).

Exports and imports of energy both rose, as did the amount of energy consumed by Canadians.

Refined petroleum products were the main source of energy consumed, followed by natural gas and electricity.



Energy use fell in NWT, New Brunswick and Newfoundland. It rose the most in Alberta, B.C. and Manitoba.

Retail pump sales accounted for 63.4% of Transportation energy.
