## Commissioner of Education Michael Williams

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- Gov. Rick Perry appointed Michael L. Williams of Arlington the commissioner of education, effective September 1, 2012. As the head of the Texas Education Agency (TEA), he oversees the state's 1,200 school districts and charter schools. Commissioner Williams, the child of two educators, is the first African-American commissioner of education in the state's history.
- Commissioner Williams is the former chairman of the Railroad Commission of Texas, the state's oldest regulatory agency. He was first appointed a railroad commissioner by then Gov. George W. Bush in 1998 and later the people of Texas re-elected him to this post, which regulates the oil and gas industry, in 2002 and 2008. Commissioner Williams served on this three-member commission until April 2011.

#### Dyslexia

Texas Education Code §38.0031, added by Senate Bill 866 (82<sup>nd</sup> Texas Legislature) states the following:

- (a) The agency shall establish a committee to develop a plan for integrating technology into the classroom to help accommodate students with dyslexia. The plan must:
  - determine the classroom technologies that are useful and practical in assisting public schools in accommodating students with dyslexia, considering budget constraints of school districts; and
  - (2) develop a strategy for providing those effective technologies to students.
- (b) The agency shall provide the plan and information about the availability and benefits of the technologies identified under Subsection (a) (1) to school districts.
- (c) A member of the committee established under Subsection (a) is not entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses incurred by the member under this section unless agency funds are available for that purpose.

Beginning in spring 2012, the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR<sup>™</sup>) will replace the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS). The STAAR program at grades 3–8 will assess the same subjects and grades that are currently assessed on TAKS. At high school, however, grade-specific assessments will be replaced with 12 end-of-course (EOC) assessments: Algebra I, geometry, Algebra II, biology, chemistry, physics, English I, English II, English III, world geography, world history, and U.S. history.



The resources on this website provide information and sample test questions to familiarize Texas educators and the public with the design and format of the STAAR assessments. The information is intended to help educators understand how the new STAAR program measures the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) curriculum standards. These resources are intended to support, not narrow or replace, the teaching of the TEKS curriculum.
