In addition, providers will receive support in creating their contracts and policies, managing employees, and preparing taxes. We will collect information on what they've learned and additional needs so that we can provide support moving forward. New and established businesses will be invited to attend an annual preview fair to showcase their program, applying their knowledge and to grow their businesses.</p> <p>These funds will be used for incentives that cover the fee for an all day early learning conference and educational materials/toys for CCIP participants that acheive their training goals.</p>

We will be providing professional development opportunities and/or materials to CCIP participants receiving coaching services through the ECE-IO coaching program.
The matching funds are for the express purpose of recruiting, training, and retaining family child care providers.
The funding supports Quality Improvement Coaching for Child Care Providers
This funding will support the recruitment, training, and/or retention of family child care providers. It will also be used to maintain the Toy Library and Early Learning Center as a resource for child care providers.
This funding is used for staff time and materials to provide trainings that fit within the CCIP structure which CCIP participants can attend. If CCIP participants join the Quality Counts program, they can also receive incentives because of this funding.
Supports early literacy trainings for providers and quality improvement materials for CCIP participants.
Provides support through a local hybrid alternative payment program to increase capacity with family child care homes. These families tend to be at higher ranks on the local Eligibility List (EL) that often do not get pulled when spaces are available. This hybrid program also works with providers to be a part of QRIS and IMPACT efforts so they are part of quality improvement efforts in the county. CCIP participants receive access to QRIS/IMPACT services by going through CCIP activities.
This funding will allow us to support activities for the child care providers in mentoring and coaching. It will also allow us to recruit new participants and offer opportunities for enrichment and growth in the child development field.

	<p>We have developed a partnership with the Human Development and Family Degree program at our local Community College to recruit and train student interns in Spring Semester of 2018. The goal is to continue our Tots and Twos Playgroups, identify and train students interested in a career with children, and ultimately increase access to early care and education. Our Resource & Referral Director will mentor the interns; they will help facilitate our playgroups, and they will attend our childcare provider trainings focused on operating and setting up a family child care program.</p>
	<p>This collaboration with CSUC Center for Healthy Communities is to provide CalFresh Outreach to eligible residents. With this funding, CCIP is able to provide CalFresh information to Family Child Care providers who can provide the information to their clients. We plan to purchase additional nutritional materials and incentives and to model healthy snacks by offering samples at our CCIP trainings.</p>
