

### The 3 Main Components of the Bridge Program



- 1. Emergency child care voucher (6-12 months) maximizes funding to support the child care needs of eligible families (AP)
- **2. Child Care Navigator** helps to increase the number of foster children successfully placed in home-based family care settings (R&R)
  - **Trauma-informed care training and coaching** *will increase capacity of child care*providers to meet the needs of foster children in their care (R&R)

### **Updates from CDSS**

- CDSS released the ACL with Opportunities for CWD to opt into the Bridge
   Program for FY 18-19
- CDSS has offered to cc R&Rs on communique in response to opt-in/out from counties so that R&Rs are aware of their county's status; we are all working to support flow of communication locally.
- FY 17-18 funds may be rolled over to FY 18-19. Be sure to expend FY 17-18 first,
   as there is no anticipated rollover into future FYs.

## **TIC Training Concept**



#### First TOT will be in Sacramento with WestEd

- Tentative August 28-29 or 29-30(12hrs)
  - Module 101: Supporting Foster Care Children in FCC/FFN Homes: Trauma and Resilience
  - Module 102: Understanding Foster Care as a System and Preventing Compassion Fatigue & Self Care
- 6 x 2-hour Webinars/Discussions
  - Review the TOT and go deeper
  - Provide feedback on the curriculum
- Two-day TOT (fall/winter 2018)
  - Trainers train on the content and receive support from the Network team with the goal of building trainer capacity to facilitate trainings on this critical subject
