| AB 9 (Coalition) | Reyes | Extension of Statute of Limitations. Unnecessarily extends the statute of limitations from one year to three years for all discrimination, harassment and retaliation claims filed with the Department of Fair Employment and Housing. | Oppose | 5/24/2019-In Senate. Read first time. To Com. on RLS. for assignment. |
| AB 23 | Burke | Office of Small Business Advocate: Deputy of Business and Workforce Coordination. Workforce Coordination. Establishes the Deputy of Business and Workforce Coordination which will help provide California with a workforce that is employment-ready and trained in industry-sectors that have the greatest workforce needs. | Support | 5/29/2019-In Senate. Read first time. To Com. on RLS. for assignment. |
| AB 36 (Coalition) | Bloom | Residential tenancies: rent control. Statewide Rolling Rent Control. Defies the will of the voters and worsens California's housing shortage by modifying the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act to allow cities to enact or expand rent control to residential properties constructed within 10 years of the date upon which the owner seeks to establish the initial or subsequent rental rate, which will discourage housing production, quality of housing, and impact low-income individuals and families. | Oppose | 4/25/2019-Re-referred to Com. on RLS. pursuant to Assembly Rule 96. |
| AB 51 (Coalition) | Gonzalez | Ban on Settlement Agreements and Arbitration Agreements. Significantly expands employment litigation and increases costs for employers and employees by banning settlement agreements for labor and employment claims as well as arbitration agreements made as a condition of employment, which is likely preempted under the Federal Arbitration Act and will only delay the resolution of claims. Banning such agreements benefits the trial attorneys, not the employer or employee. | Oppose | 5/29/2019-Referred to Coms. on L., P.E. & R. and JUD. |

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| AB 71 | Melendez | Employment standards: independent contractors and employees. | Oppose | 4/26/2019-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(2). (Last location was L. & E. on 1/17/2019)(May be acted upon Jan 2020) |
| AB 161 (Coalition) | Ting | Solid waste: paper waste: electronic proofs of purchase. Paper Receipt Ban. Would mandate almost all businesses in California offer electronic or text receipts to every customer for every transaction instead of paper receipts. California businesses would be forced to replace entire point-of-sale systems, house and protect vast quantities of personal consumer data, and be subjected to a plethora of new California Consumer Privacy Act litigation. | Oppose | 5/24/2019-In Senate. | AB 171 | Gonzalez | Sexual Harassment Retaliation Requirements. Places additional and duplicative, sexual harassment protections in the Labor Code, which are already protected under the Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA) exposing employers to additional liability including Private Attorneys General Act (PAGA) claims. | Oppose | 4/26/2019-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(2). (Last location was L. & E. on 1/17/2019)(May be acted upon Jan 2020) |
| AB 245 | Muratsuchi | California Aerospace and Aviation Commission: establishment. Encourages Development. Encourages economic development by creating the California Aerospace and Aviation Commission to support the health and competitiveness of California's aerospace manufacturing sector. | Support | 5/24/2019-In Senate. Read first time. To Com. on RLS. for assignment. Location: 5/24/2019-S. RLS. |
| AB 345 | Muratsuchi | Oil and gas: operations: location restrictions. Oil and Gas Development Ban. Would eliminate thousands of high paying California jobs and require California to import even more foreign oil by banning new oil and gas development, re-drilling operations, and rework operations by imposing a state minimum 2,500-foot setback requirement from certain structures, and further authorizing local governments to enact even greater setback requirements, without limitation. | Oppose | 5/17/2019-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(5). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 5/16/2019)(May be acted upon Jan 2020) |

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| AB 403 (Coalition) | Kalra | Division of Labor Standards Enforcement: complaint. Imposes New One-Sided Attorney's Fee Recovery. Undermines the essence of the Division of Labor Standards Enforcement (DSLE) complaint process by requiring a one-sided attorney's fee provision that will incentivize further litigation. | Oppose | 5/24/2019-In Senate. Read first time. To Com. on RLS. for assignment. |
| AB 628 | Bonta | Employment: victims of sexual harassment: protections. Uncapped New Leave of Absence for Employees and Their Family Members. Significantly expands the definition of sexual harassment under the Labor Code, which is inconsistent than the definition in the Government Code, which will lead to inconsistent implementation of anti—harassment policies, confusion, and litigation. Also, provides an unprecedented, uncapped leave of absence for victims of sexual harassment and their “family members”, which is broadly defined, that will add another layer of burdens on employers and their ability to manage their workforce. | Oppose | 5/29/2019-Read third time. | AB 720 | Muratsuchi | Community colleges: funding: instructional service agreements with public safety agencies. | Support | 5/29/2019-Referred to Com. on ED. |
| AB 764 | Bonta | Sugar-sweetened beverages: nonsale distribution incentives. Marketing Restrictions. Severely restricts marketing opportunities by beverage companies based on unproven facts regarding health effects of sugar sweetened beverages. | Oppose | 5/28/2019-Read third time and amended. Ordered to third reading. |
| AB 765 | Wicks | Health Checkout Aisles for Healthy Families Act. | Oppose | 4/26/2019-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(2). (Last location was HEALTH on 2/28/2019)(May be acted upon Jan 2020) |
| AB 766 | Chiu | Unsealed beverage container portion cap. Portion Size Limitation. Unfairly limits the sale of sugar sweetened beverages to cups of 16 oz. or less. Imposes penalties by Attorney General or local government counsel. | Oppose | 4/26/2019-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(2). (Last location was HEALTH on 2/28/2019)(May be acted upon Jan 2020) |

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| AB 882 (Coalition) | McCarty | Termination of employment: drug testing: medication-assisted treatment. Limitation on Ability to Maintain a Safe Workplace. Significantly undermines an employer's ability to maintain a safe, drug-free workplace, by prohibiting an employer from discharging an employee who has tested positive for a drug that is being used for medical purposes, which will expose employers to costly litigation. | Oppose | 4/26/2019-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(2). (Last location was L. & E. on 3/4/2019)(May be acted upon Jan 2020) |
| AB 1224 (Coalition) | Gray | Disability insurance: paid family leave program. New Three Month Leave of Absence on Employers. Before amendments, Unduly burdened and increased costs on employers, by mandating they provide an additional three-month protected leave of absence from work for family medical leave, that could total over 6 months of leave for an employee, and exposed employers to costly litigation for any alleged violation. Opposition removed due to April 22, 2019 amendments. | Oppose | 5/17/2019-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(5). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 5/8/2019)(May be acted upon Jan 2020) |
| AB 1478 (Coalition) | Carrillo | Employment discrimination. Expansion of Job Protected Leave. Significantly amends current law regarding job protected leave for jury duty, victims of a crime, domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking by creating a new private right action for potential employer violations. | Oppose | 5/29/2019-Referred to Coms. on L., P.E. & R., JUD. and APPR. |
| AB 1779 (Coalition) | Daly | Recovery residences. | Support | 5/29/2019-Read third time. Passed. Ordered to the Senate. |
| AB 1195 | O'Donnell | California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006: Low-Carbon Fuel Standard regulations. Encourages Technological Innovation. Gives credit under the Low Carbon Fuel Standard to innovative crude technologies, including carbon capture and sequestration, energy storage, and renewable natural gas or biogas. Creates jobs by encouraging the development of new technology to meet California's ambitious climate change goals. | Support | 5/29/2019-Referred to Coms. on EQ. and TRANS. |

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| SB 163 (Coalition) | Portantino | Healthcare coverage: pervasive developmental disorder or autism. Increases Health Care Premiums. Increases costs and undermines the ability of health care issuers to promote and manage applied behavioral analysis for children with autism by making a number of changes to how the autism services are provided. | Oppose | 5/22/2019-Read third time. Passed. (Ayes 32. Noes 1.) Ordered to the Assembly. In Assembly. Read first time. Held at Desk. |
| SB 171 | Jackson | Employers: annual report: pay data. Disclosure of Company Pay Data. Requires California employers to submit pay data to state agencies that could give the false impression of pay disparity where none may exist. | Support as amended | 5/22/2019-Read third time. Passed. (Ayes 27. Noes 9.) Ordered to the Assembly. In Assembly. Read first time. Held at Desk. |
| SB 204 | Dodd | State Water Project: contracts.WaterFix. Increases the costs to implement the WaterFix by creating excessive delays in the contracting process and imposes unreasonable time constraints. | Oppose | 5/24/2019-In Assembly. Read first time. Held at Desk. |
| SB 210 | Leyva | Heavy-Duty Vehicle Inspection and Maintenance Program. Increases Transportation Costs. Proposes to create a "smog check" program for heavy duty diesel vehicles, which has the potential to substantially increase the costs of transportation and goods in and from California. Gives the California Air Resources Board unfettered authority to impose uncapped fees on transportation companies and truck owners to support the inspection program. | Oppose | 5/29/2019-Read third time. Passed. (Ayes 27. Noes 10.) Ordered to the Assembly. In Assembly. Read first time. Held at Desk. |
| SB 332 | Hertzberg | Wastewater treatment: recycled water. Recycled Water. Imposes unworkable mandates on wastewater treatment and management processes resulting in increased costs to businesses as ratepayers. | Oppose | 5/17/2019-Failed Deadline pursuant to Rule 61(a)(5). (Last location was APPR. SUSPENSE FILE on 5/13/2019)(May be acted upon Jan 2020) |

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| SB 621 | Glazer | California Environmental Quality Act: court actions or proceedings: affordable housing projects. CEQA Streamline for Affordable Housing. Streamlines litigation and thereby lowers the cost to construct affordable housing projects meeting specified environmental criteria and certified under an environmental impact report by requiring that any CEQA actions challenging such projects be resolved by a court within 270 days. This reduction in litigation and costs will expedite these projects, provide more housing, and additional jobs. | Support | 5/24/2019-In Assembly. Read first time. Held at Desk. |
| SB 669 (Coalition) | Caballero | Water quality: Safe Drinking Water Fund. | Support | 5/14/2019-Set for hearing May 16. |
