

Culp or Inslee?

A Definite Difference

Every election cycle, this statement becomes more true:

“This is the most important election of our lifetime.”

This election is vital to the economic survival of Washington State and a return to the voice of ALL people in Washington having a say in our governance, not just King County. The choice we face is clear:

State Budget

Culp: huge budget shortfall means that the state legislature should already have met to revamp the budget as over 2/3 of other state legislatures have done

OR

Inslee: refuses to call a special session even though his “lockdown proclamations” have pushed Washington’s economy into crisis.

Taxes

Culp: “Facing a ‘cash deficiency’ and overall budget shortfall because of the current Governor’s actions, the state should NOT move directly to raising taxes. It should trim its spending. And these adjustments don’t have to be drastic—we can adjust to lower current tax receipts by trimming back to 2017 or 2016 spending levels.”

OR

Inslee: Fails to listen to the voters. Never-ending effort to implement a state income tax, rejected by the voters multiple times, a carbon tax added to our already nationwide high fuel taxes, increase of business taxes, which always get passed on to the consumer, and increase of property taxes...again.

Citizen’s Rights

Culp: “...the State government ignores lawlessness in our major cities, invades our privacy and interferes in parenting. This is unacceptable. The government is accountable to and serves the people *as directed by our Constitution*—not the other way around.”

OR

Inslee: no leadership on CHOP/CHAZ in Seattle, schools locked, businesses closing, Washington economy shriveling, a distasteful Comprehensive Sex Ed bill forced on families, inconsistent policies - churches were closed while rioting was ignored.

Covid-19

Culp: encourage and support public health, educate the public and then trust them to “make the best decisions for themselves”.

OR

Inslee: statewide edicts and dictatorial control, refusal to meet with legislators about emergency powers, executive over-reach.

Environment

Culp: Washington Dept. of Ecology has over-extended its role. Originally its role was to provide science-focused advice and counsel to local jurisdictions but it has morphed into a controlling, decision-making role that is “constitutionally-dubious and bad for the economy.”

OR

Inslee: Makes decisions based on his desire to be known as “the greenest governor in the country”. Claims that “clean energy economy and jobs are the future of the state” while Boeing considers leaving Washington completely and hundreds of restaurants and businesses have closed during his heavy-handed COVID edicts.

Education

Culp: Need to change budgeting process to make education funding based more on need regardless of district size. More local control, funds for families who home-school, support for overturning the new Comprehensive Sex Ed bill, K-12.

OR

Inslee: Status quo budgeting problems, more state control, supports the Comprehensive Sex Ed bill, K-12

Homelessness

Culp: “Government policy on homelessness should be to help troubled people resolve the core issues that cause their troubles. It should NOT be to enable people who are caught in downward spirals of addiction or other self-destructive behaviors. Enabling the afflicted isn’t compassionate—it’s callous and brutal.”

OR

Inslee: ...crickets...which means more of the same.
