Saskatoon – On Tuesday, August 21, members of the SEIU-West Young Workers Committee (YWC) are holding a "memorial service" for our public services at Kinsmen Park in Saskatoon to demonstrate the high level of cuts and public service closures in Saskatchewan.

"Cutting good jobs that support our local economies while slashing education, public transportation, support services, and health care hurts our communities," said Janell Kachuik, member of the SEIU-West YWC. "Our government is making decisions that are causing young people to fear for their future in this province."

The organizing groups are primarily made up of young people who are fed up by the practice of governments cutting our public services. Some participants are joining from outside Saskatchewan due to the common struggles shared across this country.
