HEALTH CARE

Approximately 12 thousand members are health care providers in four affiliated health regions. These are the Saskatoon, Cypress, Five Hills and Heartland Health Regions. Health care providers include continuing care assistants, licensed practical nurses, diagnostic and therapeutic technologists, food service workers, laundry, housekeeping, and activity personnel, maintenance, sterile processing workers, and administrative staff among others. SEIU-West also represents the health care providers who are employed with Extendicare Canada Inc. in five facilities in the province (Regina, Saskatoon, and Moose Jaw).

COMMUNITIES

SEIU-West members employed in Community-Based Organizations provide a wide variety of public services from the West Central Abilities (Kindersley) to the Prince Albert Group Homes and the YWCA of Saskatoon, the Saskatoon Crisis Nursery, Variety Place (Outlook), Metis Addictions Council of Saskatchewan Inc. (MACSI), Saskatchewan Impaired Driver Treatment Centre (Prince Albert), Elmwood Lodge and Group Homes (Saskatoon), Cheshire Homes (Saskatoon), Valley Action Group Homes and Gardiner Park Child Care Inc. (Regina), among others.

EDUCATION

Our Education sector members work in Holy Family Roman Catholic Separate School Division # 140, Chinook School Division # 211 and Southeast Cornerstone School Division # 209. They work as education assistants, caretakers, bus drivers, library technicians, tradespersons, and administrative staff and others.

PRIVATE SECTOR

Members employed in the private sector include those who work at Meadow Lake Associate Clinic, Revera Retirement Homes across the province (Bentley Retirement Homes), Samaritan Place in Saskatoon, Moose Jaw & District EMS, Bridges Personal Care home, Potters Canada Inc., and Canadian Blood Services (both Regina & Saskatoon), among others.
