5. Reports

DCCC member reports.

- a) **Chair** (Jung). Jung reported the CDP Executive Board (E Board) met in July. The By-Laws Committee recommended changes to be voted on at the November E Board. These changes will affect the allocation of CDP delegates and change the rules on who and when these delegates can vote

in races such as State Senate and Assembly. The CDP also agreed to support the DCCC's fall internship/voter registration program.

- b) **Voter Registration** (McNeil). Always be ready to register voters.
- c) **Clubs and Chartering** (Pimentel). Report on club activities and chartering, including the streamlined endorsement process for chartered Democratic clubs currently scheduled for August 16 at the LBGT Center and August 24 at Washington High School. 10-13 clubs are participating on Saturday. Westside clubs meet on Sunday. Funds raised: \$2,500 (over our goal).
- d) **Finance** (Dunning). Report on fundraising activities, including the "End of Summer Party" on August 20. Please respond to the card she passed out. Come to the party and support the Party. We'd like 200 to attend. \$25 per ticket. Support our interns and fellows. Held at Local 261 at 3271 18th Street. The state party contributed \$12,000 to continue our internship program.
- e) **Treasurer** (Hsieh). No report given in his absence.
- f) **Executive Director** (Medina). Report on Summer Internship Program, upcoming events and other matters. Have registered over 2,000 Democrats. Each intern has her/his own program to run. Come for phone-banking once per week. Pizza served.

6. **Slate Card Vendor Selection** (Dunning/Rosenthal/Wiener/Dorsey)

DeJesus – We were caused to spend additional funds with 50+1. This must be avoided.

Jung – In the case of a state election – when candidates such as Jerry Brown are on cards, those candidates generally do not contribute to the card.

Because they are on the card, in-kind forms have to be filed. If corrections have to be made, costs go up. This firm has agreed to pay any penalties.

DeJesus – sought clarification that the DCCC will not incur additional fees.

Jung – confirmed that.

50+1 (Derse) commented – it was a complicated process, but we are committed to making sure that invoices are brought in on time. I will pay for any fees incurred based on billing/filing problems.

Winning Directions (Moran and Fazio) commented - We take full responsibility for delivering on time. Jung commented that the DCCC has had

two successful election cycles with Winning Directions – professional, on-time, and responsive.

Rosenthal – call the question

Members voted: All ayes, no nays, absentions: Cohen, Ting, Pelosi, Fazio, Chiu, Speier, DeJesus.

7. **Endorsements** (Rosenthal/Jung)

Discussion and action to endorse candidates and measures for the November 4, 2014 Consolidated General Election. Discussion of the party’s endorsement process, including questionnaires and interviews.

Rosenthal commented further - Only a dozen DCCC members out of 32 people were at the Saturday endorsement meeting.

A vote at the DCCC does not equal a personal endorsement.

Avalos proposed re-convening at a later time because of events happening in certain races. Proposal was rejected.

Mandelman spoke about SEIU 1021 asking for “no endorsement.”

Smith spoke about the absenteeism (1/3) of James Fang. Does not return phone calls.

Anderson spoke about supporting labor brothers and sisters. Democrats always support labor. We should support a qualified registered Democrat.

Wiener commented that Josefowitz is on the Board of the League of Conservation Voters.

Proxy Bill Barnes stated that chairman Burton supports the incumbent Fang.

e) **Public Defender**

(Rosenthal/Fazio)

Motion to endorse Jeff Adachi approved.

Abstentions: Harris, Feinstein, Speier.

District 2

(Levitan/Pimentel) Motion to endorse Mark Farrell for District 2. Ayes have it.

(Wiener/Cohen) Motion to not have a second choice for D2.

DeJesus spoke in favor of rank-choice voting. This is Democratic.

Harris proxy to DeJesus – That is not how you acted when Campos ran.

Fazio – The public may look to us for 2nd and 3rd choices.

Proxy Bill Barnes – We could do a roll-call vote.

DeJesus – Asked for roll call vote.

Wiener – Withdrew the motion.

Jung – Conducted roll call vote. No second choice for District 2.

District 4

(Rosenthal/McNeil) Motion to endorse Katy Tang. Ayes have it.

No endorsement: Ammiano, Avalos, Campos, DeJesus.

District 6

Roll Call vote. Jane Kim wins first round. No endorsement for second round.

District 8

Roll Call vote. Scott Wiener wins first round. No endorsement for second round.

District 10

Roll Call vote. Malia Cohen wins first round. No endorsement for second round.

SFDCCC to vote on its endorsement of a California initiative ballot measure eligible for the San Francisco Democratic Party's endorsement. (In general, the California Democratic Party considers and votes on whether to endorse or reject statewide measures. However, if the state party takes "No Position" on a statewide proposition, Article VII, §5.0 of the San Francisco Democratic Party's Policies and Procedures Manual provides that "the local Party is free to take a position if it so chooses.")

- i) **Proposition 46:** Drug and Alcohol Testing of Doctors; Medical Negligence Lawsuits; Initiative Statute.

Rosenthal spoke about the draconian effects of random testing of all medical professionals.

Campos proxy is personally opposed; understands the intent; suggests a vote of "no endorsement."

DeJesus commented that the \$250,000 cap has to be lifted; bill is important; though flawed.

Mandelman associates with DeJesus' comment.

Chiu commented that he is voting "no" because of the drug privacy issues; increase on malpractice caps of non-economic damages; this will incur significant costs.

2 Ayes; 10 Nos; 13 No endorsement; 7 abstains

RESOLVED that the San Francisco Democratic Party condemns Republican James Fang's unauthorized use of the San Francisco Democratic Party's name and individual names of San Francisco Democratic County Central Committee members to attack his Democratic challenger; and be it further

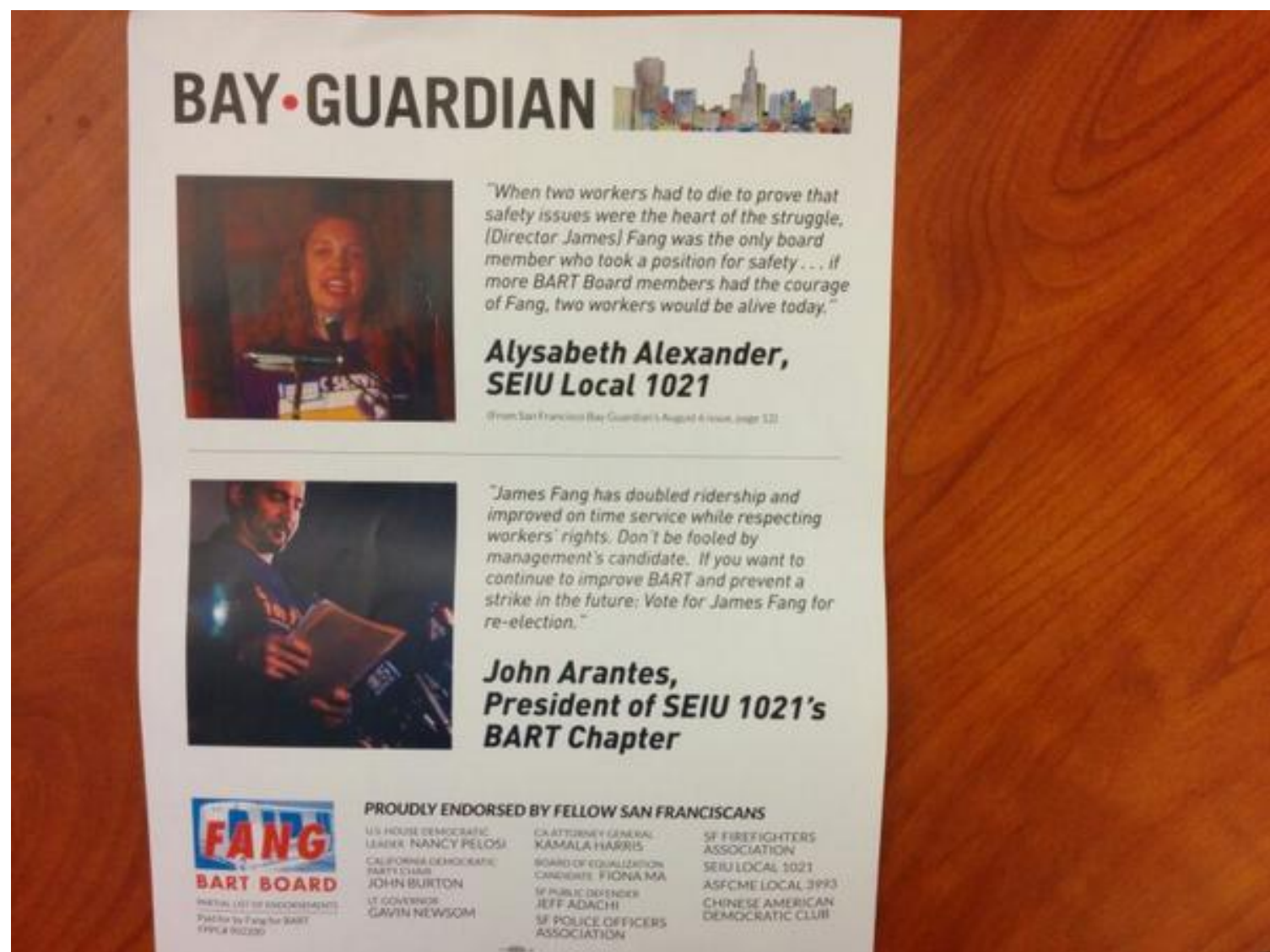
