Piccoli Resignation Gives a Fresh Start to Murray Electorate

Shooters Fishers and Farmers Party MLC Robert Borsak today called for voters in the electorate of Murray to consider a fresh alternative to the National Party after news of Adrian Piccoli's impending resignation broke in The Daily Telegraph.

"Adrian Piccoli's resignation has been a long time coming," Mr Borsak said.

"I could hear a collective sigh of relief from the electorate of Murray all the way over in New South Wales Parliament House as the news broke in The Daily Telegraph on Tuesday evening.

"The Shooters Fishers and Farmers Party will indeed be fielding a candidate in the electorate of Murray. This is an electorate that we have been watching very closely for some time now.
