The renovations project is being headed by Brother Nate McLaughin, Skullumni Secretary, along with the Skullumni Executive Board and Brother Alex Kuehling, Undergraduate Alumni Relations Chair. A meeting is scheduled later in the month to discuss the proposed options. The main areas we are looking to improve are the first floor and the chapter room. The chapter wants to remove the first floor's dilapidated wood paneling and the fraying pink wallpaper to give the house a more modern look while still cherishing the ornate woodwork. looking to expand the chapter room back into the north wing of the RAM and also create a "brothers only lounge." Everyone who is working on the project is very excited to see the changes at 89 College Ave.
