Regional Director, Legislative, and Clubs Reports

Region 6 Director:

- Hene Kelly: October 6th is the pre-endorsement meeting. It's the one time clubs have a say at what happens at the endorsement process at convention. For every 20 members you get 1 delegate. I've received those rosters and sent them in to the State Party.
- You can have a proxy. But when you do the pre-endorsement vote, you're mailed a ballot. You can send it in. You can email. If you lose the ballot, you can do it in person. But you can't do a proxy. You also can't change. If you send me your vote and then you vote a different way later, you're stuck with the first one.
- It'll be a great meeting. A fun meeting
- Ashleigh Evans: You can mail or email it?
- Hene: Yes. And we're going to be talking about candidates and platform. I'll be handing out our platform. If you're a candidate, you have to read it. But you don't have to sign it. Many don't read it but they should.
- Also, you can go to the meetings and bring up things in the platform that need to be changed. We can make it ours. It's a living document and I think that's important.
- Last time I was here I did something that was very important.
- I came here with baby challahs. Ten of them. I want to sell them.
- Hene proceeded to sell all 10 of her baby challahs.
- Chair recapped the report. Meeting coming on Saturday. Pre-endorsement conference also.

Congresswoman Jackie Speier (CA-14):

- Tom Mohr gave his time to Belinda Arriaga to speak about the situation on the border.
- Belinda spoke about her experiences with speaking with people at the border. She was there recently. So much has changed since we were last here. It's much worse now. The numbers are growing. Conditions are worse. Attitudes by officials is much more aggressive. It's been a year. It was last July that we first went. It's now been a year that we're separating children from their parents. We went in to look at the metering process. There are only 20 people per day, max. When we talked with people in Mexico, they are saying that there hasn't been anyone being taken in for over a week. It looks like it was because of the new rule that Trump implemented. Children are still being kept in cages. Children are sick. We saw 4 women who had c-section deliveries and then were returned to cages. One even ended up in ICU.
- Rep. Speier was allowed to enter the facility. She shared on her social media what she saw. The hunger, the inhumane treatment that they witnessed. The stories we heard. We had a session with ACLU and two representatives from Texas. They used the phrase "cruel chaos" to describe how this administration has dismantled the immigration process as it was before. It's so complicated and chaotic that no one knows where to start. That felt, like a reality that we have to face. He's maximized his cruelty that people don't even know what to do. It rips out your heart to see that. Not a lot can be done.
- A little bit of hope was that they all said they'd take these stories back to DC.
- Everyone should be passing along the message that doctors and social workers should be allowed in to discuss with the children and families. It would change the entire narrative. There must be something we can do.
- Brent Turner: Is there some reason they aren't letting in doctors?
- Arriaga: We saw a lot of sick kids. They aren't being allowed in. It's being heavily monitored.
- Sam Manneh: No one from should go through this. Given the magnitude of the problem, is there any potential to bring a humanitarian physician in? Any talk of that? Pelosi and Speier are talking but how come there isn't more pressure? We have to find a solution.
- Arriaga: We have to take that message. There is gatekeeping happening. There is an element of cruelty that is purposeful. You are the eyes and ears for those children. Please keep up the pressure.
- Chair: Share this on social media. Talk to your representatives. Give to Bay Area Border Relief.
