Election Integrity:

• Brent Turner: The rollout of voting machines was today in San Mateo County. The design is good. There's a touch screen which also spits out paper and you then give it to the election official with a bar code and scanner. It's a good system. These are ballots that won't have voter intent issues. The problem is that they are still run on private software. A person could still tamper with the output. We have no oversight to the software. We can't see it. This is why we are trying to move to Open Source. Mark Church mentioned that he has an understanding of public software vs. private. We're not seeing much motion at the state level. Alex Padilla has promised change.
