

Tkaronto (Toronto) Land Acknowledgement

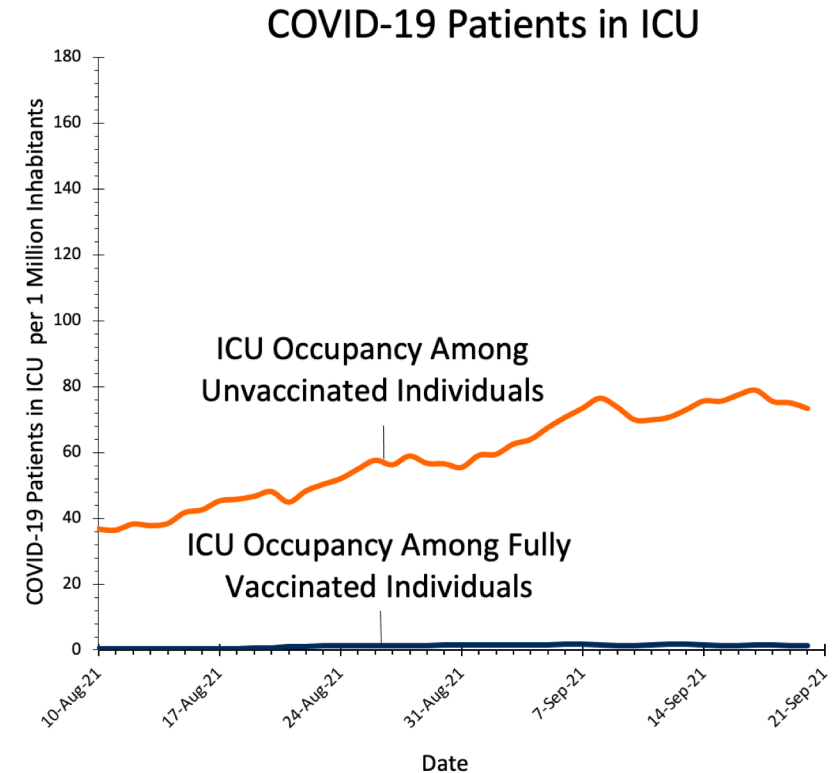
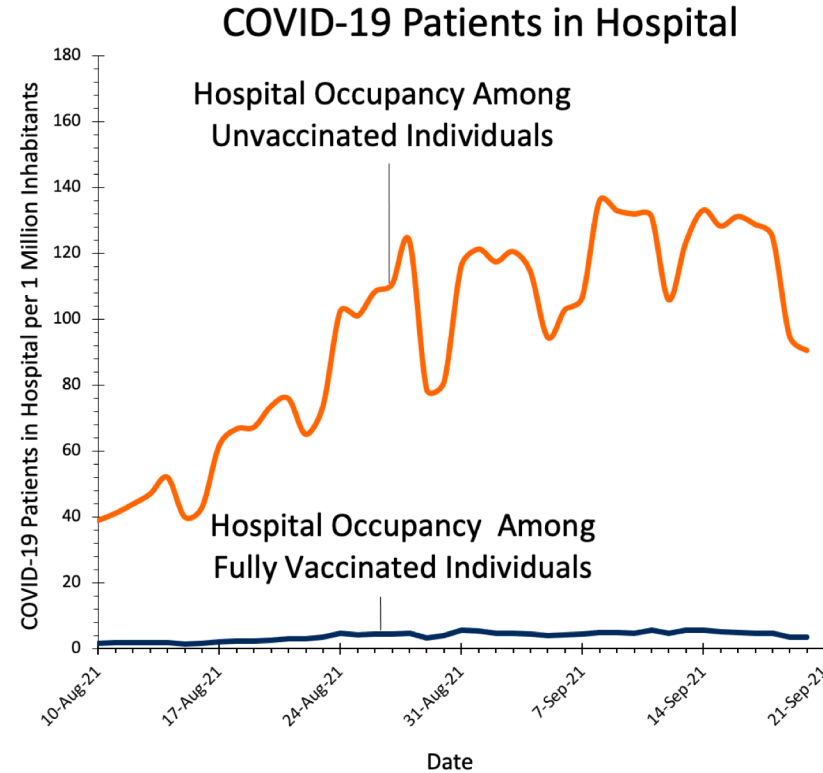
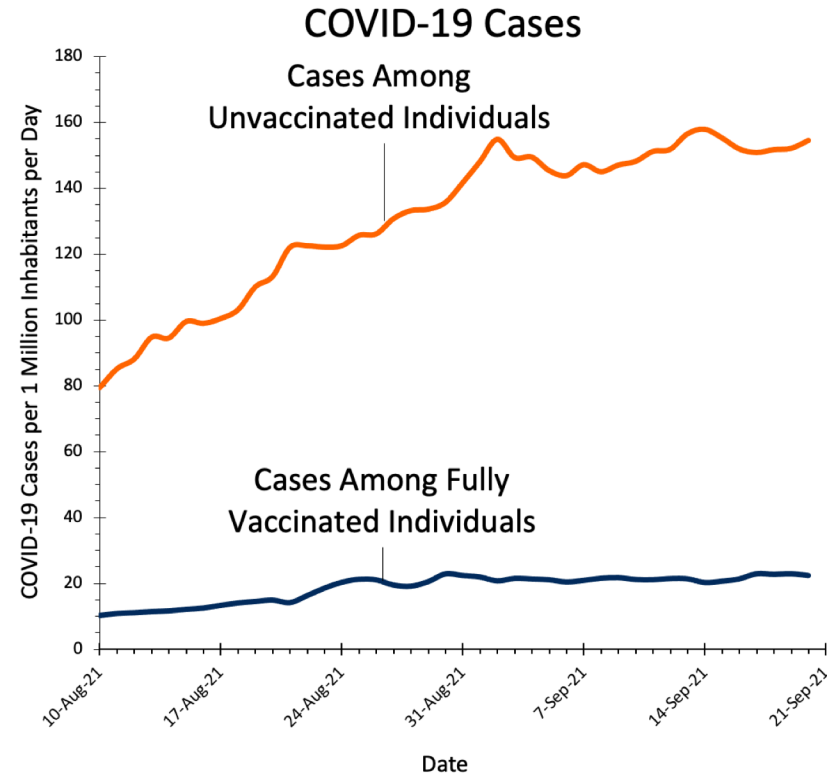

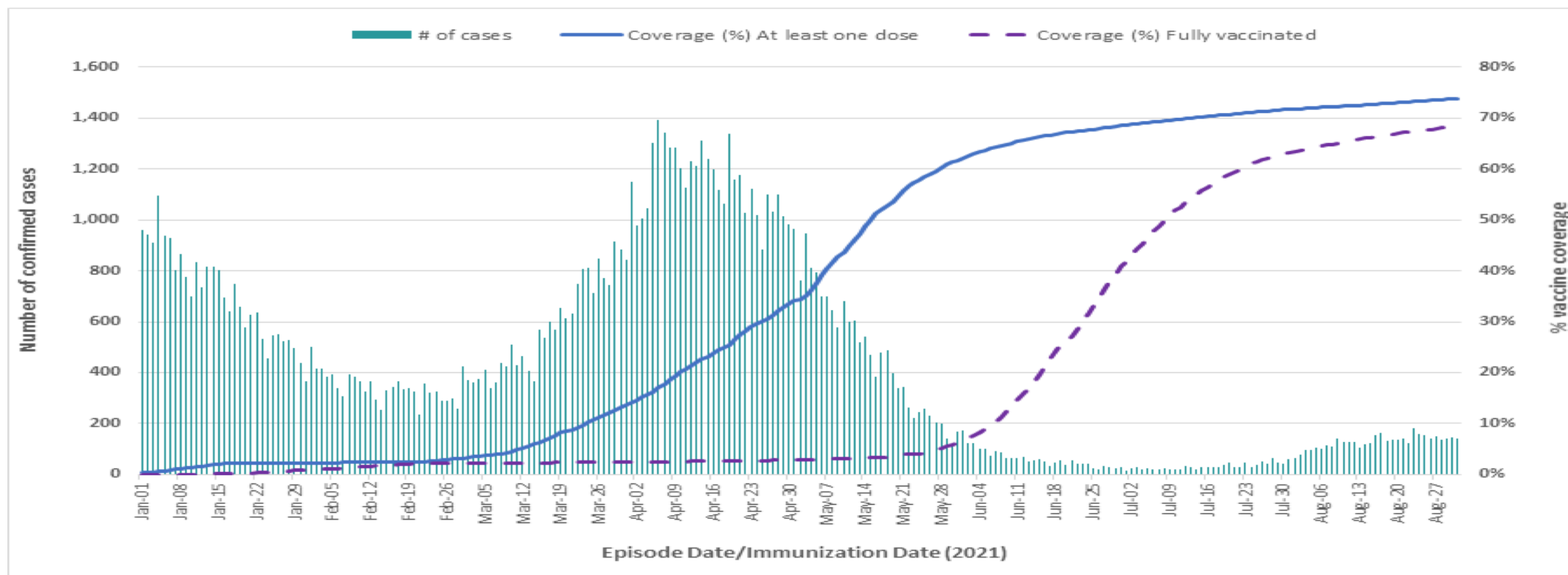

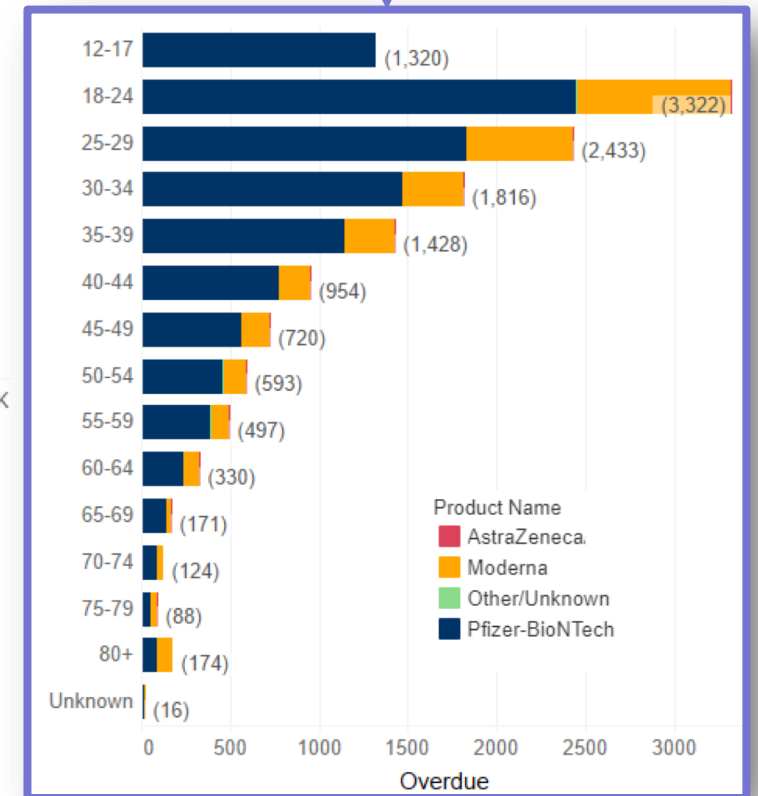
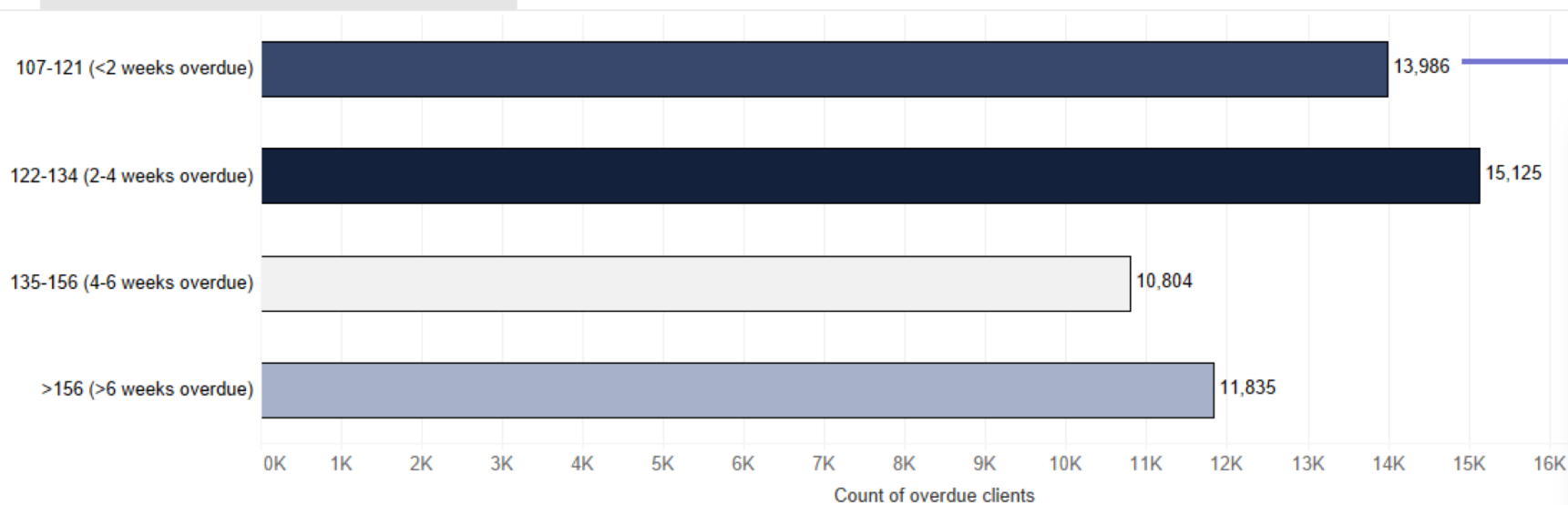

2nd Doses Continue To Be Needed

As of September 16th approximately **51,800** Toronto residents are **overdue*** for their second dose

Overdue by number of days overdue (



* Defined as 107 days from administration of first dose of any vaccine. Data as of September 16, 2021.

Third Doses

- 2 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine provides strong protection for most people against serious illness, hospitalization or death.
- A third (booster) dose is available to people with severely weakened immune systems and to vulnerable seniors & elders living in high risk congregate settings.
- Eligible individuals will be contacted by their health care provider to schedule their third dose.
- Third doses are not currently available at City of Toronto clinics.

COVID-19 & Return to School

WHAT PARENTS & CAREGIVERS SHOULD KNOW if someone at your child's school tests positive for COVID-19:



Parents & caregivers of students identified as close contacts will be notified. Schools will work closely with public health.



Close contacts who aren't fully vaccinated, or didn't have a recent COVID-19 infection will self-isolate for 10 days, monitor for symptoms & get tested.



Close contacts who are fully vaccinated, or had a recent COVID-19 infection, will continue daily screening but don't have to self-isolate.



Public Health will provide advice to close contacts & investigate all new cases, & exposures in the school.

Supporting Parents

Encourage parents to:

- ✓ Have a positive attitude about getting vaccinated.
- ✓ Share their positive personal experiences and stories.
- ✓ Talk about the benefits of vaccinations.
- ✓ Get vaccinated as a family.

All youth born in 2009 are now eligible – even if still 11 years old

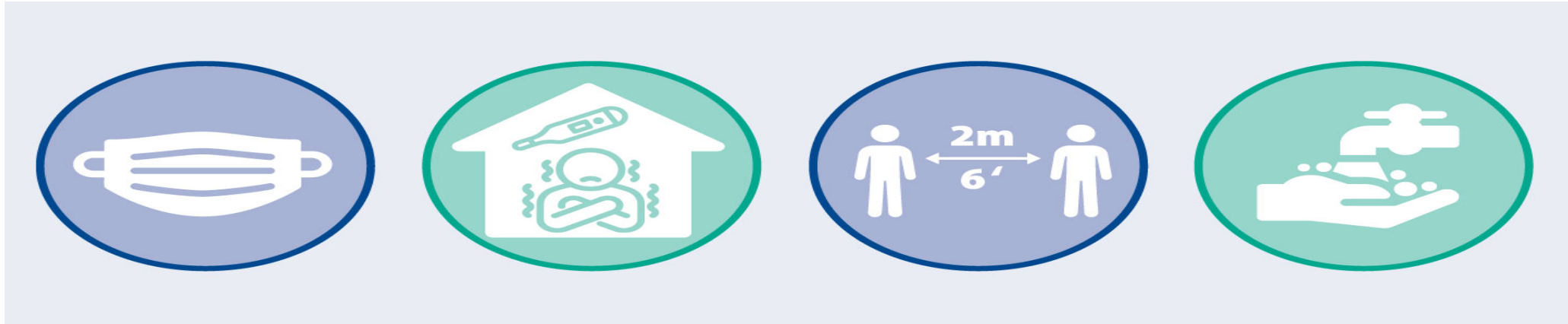
